

### Mission Matters Series 2: Prayer Life – Our Conversations with God

In this upcoming series, the mission team will again reflect on that special relationship that each Christian has with the Lord. Those relationships are centered in prayer. This 4-week series begins July 17 and will focus on three common forms of prayer: The Our Father, The Psalms and Lectio Divina.

- The Our Father is part of every Eucharistic liturgy and was prayed three times a day by the first Christian communities. Casey Green will talk about the Our Father on July 24.
- The Psalms are a mirror of God's marvelous deeds in the history of his people, as well as reflections of the human experience of the Psalmist. Carley O'Bryan will share reflections on July 31.
- Lastly, on August 7, Nick Brady will share his reflections on the ancient prayer of "Lectio Divina" which opens us up to reading and meditating on Sacred Scripture.

#### **Public Masses**

People have remarked that our Mass protocols are more stringent than other parishes they have visited and asked if we are going to ease up. The protocols are going to stay the same for the foreseeable future, so I offer this column to help explain some of why we do what we do.

- 1. Registering for Mass The governor's order and the archdiocesan guidelines limit the number of people who can attend an indoor Mass. In order to comply with those numbers and to avoid having to turn people away at the door because we have reached our capacity, we have instituted the registration policy. Also, should someone who attended a Mass at St. Mary test positive for COVID-19, we can contact other people who attended that same Mass and ask them to monitor their health or get tested.
- 2. Wearing Masks You are required to wear a face covering/mask while on church property. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), COVID-19 spreads mainly from person to person through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes, talks, or raises their voice (e.g., while shouting, chanting, or singing). Face coverings/masks, combined with other preventive measures, such as frequent hand-washing and social distancing, help slow the spread of the virus. Though the mask offers some protection to the person wearing a mask from the droplets of other people, the key protection offered by the mask is to prevent the person wearing the mask from infecting others. The mask is especially important for everyone because many who have COVID-19 will not show symptoms at first or may never have symptoms. Therefore, the CDC and Mayo Clinic recommend widespread use of simple cloth face coverings to help prevent transmission of the virus.
- 3. Social Distancing/Seating Strategy Once you have arrived at Mass, you will be directed to your pew by one of our ushers. We seat people in a particular order, so that people have minimal contact with others. Every family is seated at least six (6) feet from other families. Social distancing does not mean that people can remove their face masks. Social distancing plus face masks is the best strategy for preventing the spread of the virus.
- 4. No Communal Singing The Church has always stressed the importance of singing at the Mass. Therefore, the instruction to refrain from congregational singing goes against a very fundamental aspect of worship. However, as noted above, the science shows that singing expels particles at a higher rate and a greater distance. Therefore, we entrust our cantors to sing on our behalf. The words to the music will not be displayed on the screens, so that we will not be tempted to join in the singing.
- 5. Distribution of Holy Communion You stay in place and the Eucharistic Minister brings you Holy Communion. You are asked to sanitize your hands prior to receiving Holy Communion. You are also requested to keep your mask on until the Eucharistic Minister has left you.

I recognize that the protocols seem burdensome. However, the public health experts contend that protocols like these are necessary to keep people safe, especially when people attend indoor events for extended periods of time, such as Mass. Christian charity calls us to cooperate with these protocols so that we keep people healthy. Minimizing the spread of the virus will enable us to keep the churches open for public worship.

People have also asked for more public Masses on Sunday. I will address that question in next week's bulletin.



There are currently three ways to give electronically:



- Monthly amount transferred from your bank account (click on the DONATE button on our website home page to find a form). It would be better to mail the form to us, since you need to include a voided check.
- Weekly, monthly, or one-time checks sent by your bank or other financial service organization (contact your bank to set up a plan that works for you). It is helpful to have your envelope number on the check your bank sends to us.
- Weekly, monthly, or one-time gifts charged to your credit card (click on the DONATE button on our website home page to set up your gift).



#### **Matching Grant Opportunity for Frassati Catholic Academy**

The Richard Schulze Family Foundation is offering a \$1 Million Summer Challenge Grant for the 79 Catholic elementary schools of the Archdiocese. The purpose of the grants is to positively impact enrollment for the upcoming school year. Frassati has been approved for a \$25,000 challenge grant. # **Current Options for Mass**

- **Weekday Masses** are in the church at 8:00 AM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. People need to sign up for these Masses to attend.
- We had our first **parking lot Mass** on Friday. Everything went very well! People remain in their cars and listen to Fr. Talbot on their FM radio. Fr. Talbot says Mass outside. After Mass, we distribute Communion and then direct the cars out of the parking lot. This is the safest option we have for people who are most at risk, but everyone is welcome. The lot can hold about 35 cars. Some people came on scooters, bikes and walkers. I was there and was amazed at the sense of community, faith, and hope of those gathered. People need to sign up to attend this Mass as well.



- 9:00 AM Mass on Sundays In June, those Masses were reserved for Confirmation families. In July, we are celebrating with First Eucharist families. Beginning August 2, the socially distanced seating at 9:00 AM Mass will be open for anyone to sign up. When we have an assembly at Mass, there are a list of protocols we need to follow. Masks are required, auxiliary spaces are closed (including bathrooms), ushers determine where people sit, Mass is paced to be shorter, and there is no singing. On a scale of 1-10, 10 being the highest risk, attending Mass indoors is an 8. We have these strict protocols both to follow, CDC, MNDH, and archdiocesan protocols, but also to make the environment as safe as we can.
- Video/live stream Mass is the way most of our parish is participating in Mass. For that reason, we want to keep that Mass as much like Mass used to be as possible, engaging music, full homily, and slides to encourage participation. If people are present in the church, we cannot provide a stream with a full-length Mass and music. If it is hard for you to see the church without a congregation, please know that those of us who are there, feel your presence. You are in our minds, hearts, and prayers.
