As they talked of Jesus, all at once he stood in their midst. He had risen from the dead! But were they now convinced? A strange reaction set in, for they were now terrified and supposed they saw a ghost. The entire appearance as recorded by Luke and John opposes the idea that it was only the spirit of Jesus that they saw. He showed them his hands and side and expressly alleged that he was not mere spirit, but that he even had "flesh and bones." (Lk 24:39) They are to announce to others the "Peace/Shalom" that Jesus had offered to them!

Can they prove that Jesus is alive, that Christianity is alive also and destined to conquer the world? They (and we) have at least one qualification for doing so; they believe it themselves.

"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." (Lk 20:31)


