The entire piece was made with wires. Inside, the wires formed the star of David in the middle and the branches seem to be expanding from the outside in different directions. With this piece, Asawa was trying to indicate the rising oppression towards different groups across the globe, starting from the killing of Jewish people in Germany to the discrimination against Japanese Americans in the United States during World War II.

Looking at it from a different perspective, the outer part of it isn't as attractive as the inner part. The inner part seems more organized than the outer part. Is the message, "Don't judge a book by its cover"? Is Asawa sending us the message that just because someone looks different doesn't mean that the person is filled with bad intentions. This might be reflecting on how the United States government treated Japanese Americans during the war.

Ruth Asawa, born 1926 in Norwalk, California, was interned at the Santa Anita racetrack in Arcadia, CA. Some animators from Walt Disney Studios who were also there gave her art lessons. Later she and her family were transferred to the Rohwer War Relocation Center in Arkansas. She went to Milwaukee State Teachers College only to be barred from teaching because of her ethnicity but went on to Black Mountain College in NC. The experimental college welcomed students from persecuted groups; it was a sanctuary for Jewish academics fleeing Nazi Europe.

FROM YOUR CLERGY



WHAT ARE WE FREE FROM THIS YEAR?

One of the most prolific instructors I had while at HUC was the wonderful author, Rabbi Carol Ochs. Years ago, we spoke about how to make Passover as relevant as it possibly can be from year to year. She said

that the single most basic thing one needs to make the most of Passover is to figure out what you are free from this year that you were not free from last year. I have shared this advice before, and it makes a lot of sense as we are all held captive by something during any given year. This year is special since in addition to those personal issues from which we have freed ourselves, we also share a common issue that still "enslaves" us from which we are slowly getting free.

The ongoing constraints of the COVID-19 virus does present a challenge for us, and it becomes particularly striking at this time of year. Our freedom seems to be a moving target. Things appear to get better and then worse. We find out that a new vaccine is available, but we had great difficulty in getting vaccinated. How do we make sense of this in terms of the symbolic "freedom" we think of when we try to embrace the deeper Passover message?

As I write this, some of you may have learned that the CDC has suggested that those individuals who have been fully vaccinated may be able to get together indoors as long as they wear masks. The fact is that this could change at any time and cause even more disappointment than before. We all wanted to have a Seder of some sort in person, but it just does not seem possible this year. The congregational Seder would be quite wonderful, but we are simply not in a position to hold a live celebration, especially with food involved, well as the great numbers of congregants who always turn out to celebrate together.

Is there a truly satisfying answer to this problem? I really don't know at this time. But I do have a truly satisfying suggestion for this year. It seems that our consciousness about freedom at Passover seems to be derived from separation. Not only does Moses part the sea into two walls of water so that Jews can escape being captured, but the sea collapses back into a giant body of water just in time to separate the Egyptians from the Jews. Perhaps this year our focus on freedom should not be looking back to what we were once bound to, but rather look forward to the bonds that make our lives even more meaningful.

Even in the Torah portion, *B'Shallach*. which chronicles the miracle of the parting of the sea in the famous "Song of the Sea" the focus shifts from what actually happens in the sea to the march to the Promised Land. Is this a lesson for us to follow? Is the secret to look ahead and not just behind? If we are indeed going to celebrate Passover by appreciating our own freedoms, perhaps we should free ourselves from the need to look backward. Just as Moses and the Israelites did, we need to make plans for what is ahead of us. Uncertain as that may be, we know that we will all be together sooner than later. Perhaps this year instead of singing "Next Year in Jerusalem", we might want to consider "Next Year Together".

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT



April - A Time of Flowers, Taxes, and Budgets

April is a month of beauty and pain. Trees are green, flowers are blooming, and the heat of summer has not yet arrived. It is also a time of financial

reckoning that may be painful for some - tax season, as it is known. As a religious nonprofit, Temple Sinai does not pay taxes. We escape that pain. But our fiscal year runs from July 1st to June 30th, and thus, April is budget preparation and approval time for us.

As a prelude to our Annual Congregational Meeting Sunday, May 23, 2021, I thought I would give you a brief overview of the process we use for developing the budget for fiscal 2021-22 and which we will present to you at that meeting.

According to our by-laws, the Budget and Finance Committee shall prepare a budget of estimated revenues and expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year. On this committee is Marv Rosen, VP Finance, chair, Alan Chalfin, President Elect, Sherry Thomas Financial, Secretary, and Bob Handleman, VP Administration. I am on the committee as well.

Budget worksheets are distributed to each of the responsible Vice Presidents for each of the different cost centers. So, for example, the Gan is a cost center as is the Religious School and the Youth Group. These specific areas fall under the VP of Education. He/she will work with each of the responsible professionals to develop the next year's budget with an eye to numerous factors, including the last year or two of income and expenses, insight into what the next fiscal year will bring, e.g., do we expect an increase in the number of children enrolled for religious school? Does the Gan have space to increase capacity? Ritual will look to the revenue for the Book of Remembrance and High Holiday ticket sales, for example. Development will consider what fund raising activities we will have will we have a gala? Food Fest? Consideration is given to how we can minimize the expense of an event to maximize the contribution to the operation of the temple. Facilities will be concerned with replacing large expensive items such as our aging air conditioning units as well as the cost of lawn maintenance and security. And so it goes for each of the various operating arms of the temple.


Draft budgets from each area are presented to the Budget and Finance Committee where the details are reviewed. Then the perspective is broadened to encompass the overall financial health of the temple including cash flow and potential unplanned events Sfor costs or revenue. Cuts are made as needed. Raises provided as appropriate. A draft budget is then submitted to the entire board for review in March. Revisions are made accordingly, and the final budget goes to the board in April for approval before the annual meeting..

COVID has brought far more uncertainty to our process and our ability to forecast revenue than we have ever experienced. This 2021-22 budget also presents a challenge as we move into a more normalized year...we hope! Stay tuned for the next fiscal chapter. And put May 23 at 10 a.m. on your calendar to hear all the details.

The following Erev Shabbat on April 9th is the **Life and Legacy Service**. We have had wonderful participation in this important program from our members. 
I wanted to personally thank you for all the food you brought for our templewide food drive. I am always overwhelmed with your generosity. The food bags filled our huge bin, and your







MARCH BOARD BRIEFS

The Board of Trustees recently learned that our first Payroll Protection Plan loan has been forgiven ,and the temple has received the funds from a CARES grant. Additionally, individual private gifts have recently been received, which helped a great deal in ensuring the financial well being of Temple Sinai. Special thanks are owed to Marv Rosen and Marian Siegel for their hard work in completing and submitting application materials for relief funds. Later this spring, we anticipate making some enhancements to the sanctuary, including beautiful bookshelves to hold our collection of prayerbooks.

In February, members of the board dedicated time in a day-long retreat to help craft mission and vision statements for the temple in conjunction with Rabbi Kahn. The language is currently being refined and clarified to ensure it is an adequate reflection of the thought that went into these statements. The board also elected to form a team to work as part of the URJ Benchmarking Project. This project involves some self-study and reflection and allows us to access data the project compiles from participating URJ congregations, such as operating data and information about early childhood education.

Some members of the board, as well as some congregants, have formed a task force to create a self-reflection tool about practices enacted during the pandemic. There may be some innovations we wish to retain even after the world returns to a semblance of normalcy.


