LAKE COUNTY GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT RECOMMENDS SENIOR CENTERS REMAIN CLOSED UNTIL 2021

Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) recommends Lake County senior centers remain closed until January 1, 2021. At that time, the decision will be reassessed. Continued closures will minimize risk, prevent morbidity and mortality, and allow the time necessary for centers to develop proper testing protocols and safety measures, train staff, and monitor the burden of COVID -19 on Lake County's most at-risk residents. Limited appointment-only services at senior centers may be approved on a case-by-cases basis.

In determining this recommendation, LCGHD considered a variety of factors including access to adequate COVID-19 testing for both staff and participants, senior center staff training needs, local hospital census, case status in both Lake and surrounding counties in accordance with the Ohio Public Health Advisory System, and seasonal flu immunizations and projections.

According to the CDC, the risk of severe illness from COVID-19 increases as people grow older, and includes people of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including:

- People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma;
- People who have serious heart conditions;
- People who are immuno-compromised;
- People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 or higher);
- · People with diabetes:
- People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis; and
- People with liver disease.

As people age, their immune systems change, making it more difficult for their body to fight off disease and infection, and because older adults are also more likely to have underlying health conditions, recovery can be more difficult. To date, sixty-three percent of Lake County residents hospitalized with COVID-19 were over 60 years of age. This age group also accounts for 63% of ICU admissions, and 96% of COVD-19 fatalities in Lake County.

LCGHD will work with senior center directors and staff to develop a plan for a safe re-opening of their facilities, including but not limited to testing, reporting, training, assessment, and other critical infrastructure to prevent COVID-19.

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

Community Information



Public transit travel in Willoughby & Lake County is about to expand.

Route 8 will operate hourly from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on weekdays and every two hours on Saturdays.

Route 9 will provide peak service connecting downtown Painesville and Tyler Boulevard with service to Diamond Centre in Mentor. Service will operate weekdays from 5:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 2 to 6 p.m.

<u>Route 9</u> will operate with a smaller Dial-a-Ride style bus equipped with amenities of a traditional fixed-route bus, including bike racks, stop cords, a destination sign and a fare box.

Laketran is also making a slight change to <u>Route 3</u> along Lake Shore Boulevard in Willoughby to travel along Tamarac Boulevard/Lost Nation Rd. in efforts to better serve the residential area.

Ride Laketran <u>Dial-a-Ride</u> to any Senior Center in Lake County free! Laketran and the Lake County Board of Commissioners partner to provide Lake County Senior Citizens free Laketran Dial-a-Ride transportation to any Senior Center in Lake County. The trips will be paid for by funds from the Lake County Senior Services Levy. You simply need to reside in Lake County and be 60 or older.

The Lake County Council on Aging's Gatekeeper Program

The Council on Aging provides care and service for older adults. This agency is dedicated to supporting those adults feeling isolated, living alone, and in need of some type of assistance to their independence.

The Gatekeeper Program has been designed by community volunteers to watch and listen for the signs that indicate an elderly person is in need of assistance. Once a referral is received, it is reviewed by a nurse and a social worker who discuss the action to be taken. A referral is then made to other resources in the community. If the plan is accepted by the elder, ongoing case management is received and followed for a minimum of three months.

If you know of an elder who needs assistance or if you would like to become a Gatekeeper, please contact the Lake County Council on Aging at (440) 205-8111.


