
### MISSION STATEMENT

This Valentine's Day (Friday, February 14<sup>th</sup>) be a Valentine to someone who can truly use one. St. Adalbert's Church will be open from 9:30am to 5pm collecting items for the Haven House. Items can also be dropped off at the 4:30pm mass on Feb. 15th Haven House Inc., a 501(c)3 agency founded in 1983 and located in Hammond, Indiana, is a 24-hour emergency shelter for domestic violence victims and their dependents. Haven House provides services to Hammond, East Chicago, Whiting, Munster, Griffith, and Highland, which comprises a significant geographic area of Northwest Indiana. The facility is a three-story six bedroom house which can comfortably accommodate 21 people.

The purpose of Haven House is to provide safe housing, the essentials for everyday living, and support services to female adults and their children who are victims of domestic/sexual assault and to assist them in breaking the cycle of violence through education, counseling, advocacy, referral, and skill building techniques.

If you are unable to give something physical, you are always welcome to give the gift of prayer. The church will be open to collect donated items or for you to stop by and say a prayer or light a candle for those who suffer from domestic violence.

## St. Vincent DePaul Society Reports

## Report for 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter (Oct. thru Dec. – 2019)

With the continued support of the Whiting/Robertsdale Catholic Communities, the St. Vincent DePaul Society was able to assist **57** needy families in our area by providing a total of **\$4743.02** in support. The money was used to help families meet obligations in the following ways; 13 with rent or mortgage payments, 34 with utilities, 6 with food, 2 with water bills, 1 with city services, and 1 with transportation. In addition **\$600.00** has currently been pledged to **10** families who are in the process of completing pledge assistance.

#### SVDP Year End Report for 2019

Over the past year the St Vincent DePaul Society has helped **412** families or individuals who were in need of support. We were able to provide **\$24,713.00** in financial relief to these families or individuals. In addition to financial support, members have done home visits, hospital and prison visits, provided car transportation to neighbors for groceries or appointments, furniture to those in need, and phone information and support to those requesting help.

The members of the St. Vincent DePaul Society would like to thank all the individuals and organizations who supported our ministry with their prayers and financial gifts the past year. The Society is a prayer based ministry that reaches out to our neighbors in need. We meet at 6:00pm on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of the month in the Founders Room of St. John's School.
