
### **MISSION STATEMENT**

# The 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time THE WORD OF GOD SUNDAY

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis published his Apostolic Letter establishing that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the Word of God".

It's not coincidental that today's Gospel relates Jesus' initial call to two sets of brothers, Peter and Andrew and James and John. They immediately leave their fishing industry to embark on a new vocation as "fishers of men" accepting, living and sharing the Word of God. No excuses, no hesitation, just abrupt attention to the one who would completely change their lives and the lives of those to follow.

What about us? We come to Sunday Mass. We support a Catholic School where Gospel values are shared and lived, and we try to live as Jesus would have us live. Is there more that we can do?

In his apostolic letter Pope Francis invites us never to take God's Word for granted, "but instead to let ourselves be nourished by it, in order to live fully our relationship with [God] and with our brothers and sisters".

God's Word has the power to open our eyes and enable us to renounce a stifling and barren individualism and instead to embark on a new path of sharing and solidarity.

This Valentine's Day (Friday, February 14<sup>th</sup>) be a Valentine to someone who can truly use one. St. Adalbert's Church will be open from 9:30am to 5pm collecting items for the Haven House. Items may also be dropped at the available boxes at SJB parking lot entrance. The contents will then be delivered to SA's on Feb. 15th.

Haven House Inc., a 501(c)3 agency founded in 1983 and located in Hammond, Indiana, is a 24-hour emergency

shelter for domestic violence victims and their dependents. Haven House provides services to Hammond, East Chicago, Whiting, Munster, Griffith, and Highland, which comprises a significant geographic area of Northwest Indiana. The facility is a three-story six bedroom house which can comfortably accommodate 21 people.

The purpose of Haven House is to provide safe housing, the essentials for everyday living, and support services to female adults and their children who are victims of domestic/sexual assault and to assist them in breaking the cycle of violence through education, counseling, advocacy, referral, and skill building techniques.

If you are unable to give something physical, you are always welcome to give the gift of prayer. The church will be open to collect donated items or for you to stop by and say a prayer or light a candle for those who suffer from domestic violence.


