
MISSION STATEMENT

The 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time The Presentation of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the Christ-child being taken to the temple to be presented to God. The irony is that in giving their child to God, God is actually giving the child to us.

Do we recognize the Messiah in our midst? Do we share the good news of mercy and salvation?

Although the Holy Family is central to the story, the prophetic figures, Simeon and Anna, quickly recognize the significance of Jesus and boldly proclaim him to all. Simeon taking the babe from his mother Mary, lifts him on high and prophesies that he will be "a light to the Gentiles and glory for Israel". He then predicts the sorrow that Mary will bear.

Jesus, the Savior of the World will be a contradiction to many. Like his mother, we too will be called to share his cross.

What enters your mind when you realize that accepting Jesus as the Messiah also means accepting the cross?

Like Simeon and Anna, we are the community of believers, mandated to declare to the world Jesus...the Glory of God and the Gift of Salvation.

What cross are you carrying right now that you can offer to Jesus?

BLESSED CANDLES

It has been a centuries old tradition of the Catholic Church to celebrate the **Feast of the Presentation of the Infant Jesus, 40 days after his birth** (Lk 2:22). The February 2nd Feast has been referred to as *Candlemas*, and candles to be used in the homes of the faithful throughout the year are blessed on that day.

Like the tradition of Blessing Homes, the tradition of burning blessed candles provides an opportunity for all the faithful to enter more fully into the universal prayer of the Church, as we **rededicate our homes and our families to living in the** "*light of Christ*".

Candles will be blest at the Feb. 1st /2nd weekend liturgies. Every family is encouraged to take a blest candle home and use it in times of storm, strife, and calamity. With the Church's blessing the votive candle is meant to remind us of Christ's ever-present light, a beacon of hope whenever trouble lurks. An appropriate prayer, which may be prayed when the candle is lit, is included with the candle. Each is available near the baptismal font.

THROAT BLESSING

Monday, **February 3rd is the Feast of St. Blaise,** a 4th century martyred bishop, who while in prison was credited with miraculously healing a young boy who was choking from a fish bone, lodged in his throat. Some say that Blaise was a physician before becoming a bishop. During the Middle Ages devotion to St. Blaise grew in popularity as individuals asked for his intercession for ailments of the throat. Thus the tradition of blessing throats with blest candles has endured through the ages.

"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may the Lord free you from evils of the throat and from any other evil."

This Valentine's Day (Friday, February 14th) be a Valentine to someone who can truly use one. St. Adalbert's Church will be open from 9:30am to 5pm collecting items for the Haven House. Items may also be dropped at the available boxes at SJB parking lot entrance. The contents will then be delivered to SA's on Feb. 15th.

Haven House Inc., a 501(c)3 agency founded in 1983 and located in Hammond, Indiana, is a 24-hour emergency shelter for domestic violence victims and their dependents. Haven House provides services to Hammond, East Chicago, Whiting, Munster, Griffith, and Highland, which comprises a significant geographic area of Northwest Indiana. The facility is a three-story six bedroom house which can comfortably accommodate 21 people.

The purpose of Haven House is to provide safe housing, the essentials for everyday living, and support services to female adults and their children who are victims of domestic/sexual assault and to assist them in breaking the cycle of violence through education, counseling, advocacy, referral, and skill building techniques.

If you are unable to give something physical, you are always welcome to give the gift of prayer. The church will be open to collect donated items or for you to stop by and say a prayer or light a candle for those who suffer from domestic violence.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Solemnity of the Presentation of the Lord is a feast that is some sixteen centuries old. It occurs forty days after Christmas and is the last echo of the Christmas season as the Church year moves forward

The Presentation is about a great deal more than Jesus' being brought to the Temple one afternoon to comply with Jewish Law. It is about Jesus coming to us as fulfillment, as hope and as truth. Jesus is the glory of Israel and a light to the Gentiles, the illumination for every culture and era. He is the way to the Father, the path to a fulfilled life in God's sight, the road to living in the image of the God that we were created to be. Jesus embodies the hope of eternal life embedded in every human being.

Hundreds of people came to the Temple that day and noticed the Baby. Simeon alone embraced the Child and saw in Him fulfillment, hope and truth. Lots of people will come to church today, give a nod to Christ and then move on with their lives unchanged. This last echo of Christmas, this Church year, teaches us that we can be like Simeon. We can embrace Christ more fully as He comes to the "temple" of our lives and see in Him our fulfillment, our hope and our truth.
