
# **MISSION STATEMENT**

- How can I enhance the flavor of daily life with God's goodness, kindness and mercy, melting cold hearts with Jesus' love? May I live each day with JOY.

When we **draw close to Jesus in prayer**, asking him to melt our stony hearts and replace within us a portion of his sacred heart, we will **gain the wisdom and courage to be his true disciples.**

#### **BE A VALENTINE!**

This Valentine's Day (Friday, February 14<sup>th</sup>) be a Valentine to someone who can truly use one. St. Adalbert's Church will be open from 9:30am to 5pm collecting items for the Haven House. Items may also be dropped at the available boxes at SJB parking lot entrance. The contents will then be delivered to SA's on Feb. 15th.

Haven House Inc., a 501(c)3 agency founded in 1983 and located in Hammond, Indiana, is a 24-hour emergency shelter for domestic violence victims and their dependents. Haven House provides services to Hammond, East Chicago, Whiting, Munster, Griffith, and Highland, which comprises a significant geographic area of Northwest Indiana. The facility is a three-story six bedroom house which can comfortably accommodate 21 people.

The purpose of Haven House is to provide safe housing, the essentials for everyday living, and support services to female adults and their children who are victims of domestic/sexual assault and to assist them in breaking the cycle of violence through education, counseling, advocacy, referral, and skill building techniques.

If you are unable to give something physical, you are always welcome to give the gift of prayer. The church will be open to collect donated items or for you to stop by and say a prayer or light a candle for those who suffer from domestic violence.

#### PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

#### **SALT AND LIGHT - PART ONE**

The Lord says that we are supposed to be the "salt of the earth" and "the light of the world." In fact, it's a compliment we use today when we say that someone is the "salt of the earth." Yet, we know there is nothing so inedible, so unhealthy, as salt all by itself. During a famine, you can't eat it. In a drought, you don't even dare come near salt. Salt is useful only as an additive. Salt can bring out flavor and be a preservative when mixed with something else to prevent deterioration. We are the salt of the earth when we are an active part of our community, serving as a preservative.

The same is true with being the "light of the world." Light by itself can blind us. Staring at the sun or a light bulb can harm us. Light is useful when it enables us to see other things better. So we are the light of the world. We should light up consciences, minds and

How are we salt and light? Isaiah points out some ways that we have come to call the corporal works of mercy: feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, giving drink to the thirsty, visiting the sick and those in prison, burying the dead. These are the classical works of mercy. The early Church did them and the Church does them today. They are tangible ways of being salt and light. These are things that we can do personally, or that we can support through the parish poor box, the St. Vincent de Paul Society or Catholic Charities.
