Dear Parish Family,

Our experience of what it's like to live with the COVID-19 virus in our world has been changing day to day. To comply with directives from Bishop McElroy in response to Governor Newsom's executive order Thursday, March 19th, asking us all to "shelter in place", we have enacted the following in the interest of protecting the health of all the members of our community.

Sacraments in General:

- Public Masses will continue to be suspended.
- Baptisms which cannot be postponed must be Private and include only members of the immediate family up to ten people including the clergy and the child.
- · Rites for the Dead are limited to interment services at the cemetery with less than ten people including the clergy; Funeral Masses must be postponed until COVÍĎ-19 has been contained.
- There can be NO Communion services or communal Liturgies of the Word
- Weddings are to be postponed, or, can continue with less than ten people present including the clergy. Quinceañeras must be postponed.
- The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is to be provided for those who are dying or experiencing a
- medical emergency. The sacrament of <u>Confession is available by</u> appointment.

Confirmation, First Communions, and Easter Sacraments and Liturgies:

- Confirmation and First Communions will have to be rescheduled when the reality of the current crisis becomes clearer.
- We will NOT have a communal celebration the Sacred Triduum – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. The Easter sacraments usually given to those participating in the RCIA will be postponed to Pentecost.

Church and Office CLOSED:

The parish campus — both church and office — will be CLOSED, and staff will be working remotely. Please be patient as we adjust to this new reality and seek to respond to phone calls and emails remotely.

We will continue to develop virtual means for ministry online to be a spiritual support during these unusual and challenging days. Please visit our website regularly for updates: www.saintpiusx.org and subscribe to our YouTube, Facebook, and Instagram.

Let us continue to keep up our habits of prayer which bring peace to our hearts.

Querida Familia Parroquial,

Nuestra experiencia de cómo es vivir con el virus COVID-19 en nuestro mundo ha cambiado día a día. Para cumplir con las instrucciones del Obispo McElroy en respuesta a la orden ejecutiva del Gobernador Newsom, que entro en vigor el jueves 19 de marzo, pidiéndonos a todos "quedarnos en casa", hemos promulgado lo siguiente con el interés de proteger la salud de todos los miembros de nuestra comunidad.

Sacramentos en general:

- Las misas públicas continuarán suspendidas.
- Bautizos que no puedan ser pospuestos deben ser privados e incluir solo a miembros de la familia inmediata, solo se permite un máximo de diez personas, incluidos el clero y el niño presentado a bautizar.
- Ritos funerarios se limitan a los servicios de sepelio en el cementerio con no mas de diez personas, incluido el clero; las misas de funeral deben posponerse hasta que el virus COVID-19 hava sido contenido.
- NÓ puede haber servicios de comunión o liturgias comunitarias de la Palabra.
- Las bodas deben posponerse o pueden llevarse a cabo con un máximo de diez personas presentes, incluyendo el clero.
- Las quinceañeras deben posponerse. El sacramento de la unción de los enfermos se administrará a • aquellos que están a punto de morir o en estado de enfermedad grave.
- El sacramento de confesión está disponible con cita previa.

Confirmación, Primeras Comuniones, Sacramentos y Liturgias de Pascua:

- Confirmaciones y Primeras Comuniones deberán reprogramarse cuando la realidad de la crisis actual se aclare.
- NO tendremos una celebración comunitaria del Triduo Sagrado - Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y Domingo de Pascua. Los sacramentos de Pascua que generalmente se entregan a los participantes en el RICA se pospondrán a Pentecostés.

Iglesia y Oficina CERRADAS:

El campus de la parroquia, tanto la iglesia como la oficina, estarán CERRADAS y el personal trabajará de forma remota. Pedimos su paciencia mientras nos adaptamos a esta nueva realidad y tratamos de responder a las llamadas telefónicas y correos electrónicos de forma remota.

She could see the Mass being celebrated and even hear the songs being sung.

This story from St. Clare's life reminds us of her love for the Eucharist and the celebration of Holy Mass. Let us praise the Lord that in our own day the Lord has provided the beautiful gift of technology which allows us to tune in online and on TV to participate in the celebration of Holy Mass. Though we may be pained by the inability to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, we are blessed to be able to participate through social media.

Rite of Christian Initiation *Questions and Answers*

• Why are the elect presented with the Creed and the Lord's Prayer?

A Now that the elect have finished their initial formation and draw closer to the waters of Baptism, the Church finds them ready to receive and pray with the Creed and the Lord's Praver. During the Third Week of Lent, the assembly "hands over" the Creed to the elect. The elect will "give back" or recite the Creed on Holy Saturday as part of the preparation rites. During the Fifth Week of Lent, the elect are given the Lord's



Prayer, which will become their prayer as Christians. These presentations entrust to the elect the discipline of faith and prayer.
