Please pray for the soul of Ted Casillas and Alfredo Gomez who passed away this week. May God grant them eternal rest and bring consolation to their families.

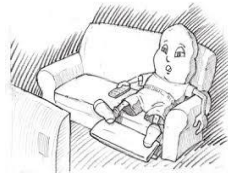
