

SAIL SUMMER SESSION FAMILIES

Dear Parents:

With the changing environment due to COVID-19 and the challenges we face to maintain the current Archdiocese guidelines for gathering at St. Brendan, we have decided that our Summer SAIL Faith Formation for Kindergarten - 5th grade will be canceled for 2020.

We understand this news may be disappointing, and we are truly sorry. Please know we did not take this decision lightly but felt it was in the best interest of your children and our parish family.

The good news! St. Mary's Press, the creator of the curriculum we use in class, *Discover! Finding Faith in Life (Grades 1-5)*, is almost done creating a distance-learning, web-based program to assist parents in providing faith formation to their children from their home. Please visit: *https://www.smp.org/resourcecenter/resource/13814/#*, to watch the webinar St. Mary's Press has provided to introduce this program to parishes and parents.

When St. Mary's Press notifies us that the distance learning program is complete, we will notify you so you can pick up your child's curriculum folder and then your child can begin to work on it at home. We will have the ability to monitor and track your child's progress as each chapter is completed.

Our hope is that we will have in-person classes starting in mid-August. If you would prefer to enroll your child in the Sunday or Wednesday SAIL class that meets twice a month during the school year, please email SAIL (K-6th grade) Faith Formation Coordinator Cynthia Cusimano at *ccusimano@stbrendansatl.com*.

For our Kindergarten parents, our catechist has graciously offered to take her lessons and turn them into daily packets that will detail what to do and attach the craft. As soon as those are ready and available for pick up at the church, we will email you .


