THE COMMUNION RITE THE LORD'S PRAYER (continued)

"...thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

The Preface for the Solemnity of Christ the King describes well what we're requesting when we pray that the Kingdom of God come:

[our Lord Jesus Christ] by offering himself on the altar of the Cross as a spotless sacrifice to bring us peace, ... might accomplish the mysteries of human redemption and, making all created things subject to his rule, he might present to the immensity of your majesty an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace.

The Father wants us to all enter into his Kingdom. Our Lord offered himself on the altar of the Cross to bring us peace, and now we offer him once again, sacramentally, so that we might receive peace and so the Kingdom may extend to our hearts and captivate and conquer them with God's love. The Father already reigns in Heaven; we pray he reigns on earth as well.

"Give us this day our daily bread..."

Many of the early Church Fathers saw this petition as the central reason for including the Lord's Prayer in the celebration of the Eucharist. At each celebration of the Eucharist it has special significance, because the Bread of Life is the sustenance we truly need. We need to ask for our daily sustenance but it is the Bread of Life that will permanently satisfy us from here to eternity.

"...forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us..."

After hallowing the Father's name and asking for our daily bread and preparing for the Bread of Life, we also ask forgiveness for those times when we haven't respected Him or others, and express our willingness to imitate his mercy. This petition evokes the parable of the unforgiving servant (Matthew 18:21-35), a parable given in response to Peter's question about how often we should forgive.

We can imagine that unforgiving servant as being Adam after the Fall: he owed so much (10,000 talents in the original Greek, the equivalent wages of 160,000 years of labor) that not only was his freedom and property forfeit, but that of his entire family as well. With no freedom and no "capital" he'd never be able to repay his debt. Adam and Eve cost all of humanity their communion with God due to their sin; the rest of us didn't commit it, but we suffered its consequences, and still do. The Lord, like the king in the parable, forgave the whole debt. Everything the servant deserved to lose, he retained, due to the king's mercy.

How does the servant respond? He decides to turn a new leaf in life by becoming a loan shark collecting on his old debts. The amount his fellow servant owed him was infinitesimal compared to what he'd just been forgiven. His repentance was shown to be short lived.

We've received a priceless gift of mercy through faith and Baptism. We can never repay that debt. When someone wrongs us, we have to remember that no matter how much they've wronged us, it's nothing compared to how much the Lord has forgiven us and continues to forgive us.


