#### **FATHER RAY'S PASTORAL NOTES** X-RAYS

In celebrating the Howdy! Third Sunday (and week) of Advent, we enter the days tradi-

tionally known by the Wisdom literature, O antiphons. We know one O antiphon very well and sing it often in this season, "O, come, O Come Emmanuel." This one of many of these O antiphons, written in prose and poetic style to emphasize and direct us to the Christ figure, so prophesized, who believe is Jesus, our Emmanuel

O radiant light, O son divine, O wisdom from on high are other examples of these, O antiphons. In the classic celebrating, they are chanted by a choir or cantor with an antiphonal response on the part of the people. Today, we sing these names of the Messiah and Lord in hymn

I pray them in morning prayer of the Divine Office- one each day and add to each, as I like doing as reflection, the others names of the day before, so that at the of the 7 days prior to Christmas, the whole of the messiah as known or announced comes to be.

Crunch time is also another part of this time of the year. While we are not focused on Advent, (yet we should be) our minds move to completing the many things we wish to have done for Christmas and the celebrations that take part in light of the Christmas holiday (er, holyday). Those things include: baked goods, decorations, gift buying and wrapping, and even the cleaning of the house, as well as cleaning or washing dishes and serving utensils that will be used at the Christmas dinner.

I recall washing all the wine glasses and my sisters ironing napkins in anticipation of the family coming over for Christmas dinner. In preparation, there was the crocheted table cloth of Grandmas that went with the flower arrangement that adorned the table.

Now we didn't have a dining room per se - it was the extension of the kitchen but I was responsible to get the leaves out 'n wash them down, so that everyone could sit around the table.

That's the concept of our church too – to gather around the table of the Lord. Ideally, it would mean having an altar in the round and all of us gathered around the sides seeing each other, yes, but more gazing upon the gifts of bread and wine that become for us, the presence of Jesus. Jesus has been invited into our hearts doing what he asked of us to do, and from this celebration, our Eucharist. And we rejoice.

Rejoice Sunday it is on this Third Sunday of Advent. "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice." Let's be joyfilled folks as we enter the hubbub of the holiday season, centering ourselves on the holyday that Christmas is for us!



### Pastoral and Sacramental Guidelines

#### **Baptism**

Infant baptisms are celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 11:30 Mass (or after). Parents requesting baptism of their child or children must contact the parish office, be bap-



tized (or at least one parent), registered and active members of the parish. They must attend a baptism class at least one month prior to the baptism. Newly registered members must wait three months prior to a request.

#### Marriage

Couples seeking to be married at St. Roch's must contact the pastor to secure a date, contacting him at least six months or more, prior to their desired date. One member of the party must be a baptized Catholic, active and registered at St. Roch's (or through their parents). The couple will then be instructed in the marriage preparation program. Non-catholic members (of the party) or previously married members are not restricted from entering into marriage, so long as they are free to marry according to the laws of the Catholic Church.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

Any member of the parish may be anointed prior to surgery, beginning therapies, suffering chronic illnesses, having reached



old age and/or having been hospitalized. This sacrament of healing is for the living (conscious and alert) and can be celebrated in church, at home or in the hospital. Please contact the parish office for a visit to be arranged. Emergencies always take precedence.

#### **First Eucharist and Confirmation**

Please contact the religious education office for information regarding these initiation rites, requirements and subsequent celebrations.

#### Reconciliation

This healing sacrament is celebrated every Saturday afternoon at 3Pm in the church or by appointment.

# GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### 3rd Sunday of Advent

Who did you come to see? A version of this question is posed by Jesus many times in the Gospels. He asks it of Andrew and John when they begin to follow him. He asks it of Mary Magdalene in the garden of the resurrection. He asks it in today's Gospel. "What did you go out to the desert to see?" There is something innately human about "seeing." Animals have eyes — some with much more powerful vision than our own — but that's not the kind of seeing Jesus is talking about. We could phrase the question several other ways. "What are you looking for?" "What are you longing for?" "Whom do you seek?'

It is in seeing for ourselves that our suspicions or hypotheses are confirmed, that our desires discover their fulfillment, and that we can rest for a moment in certainty. John the Baptist sought certainty of Jesus' identity. "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus sends word to him based on the testimony of sight, observations of the mighty deeds Jesus has begun to work. "Go and tell John what you hear and see."

God recognizes our desire to see. In the Incarnation, the Word is made flesh. The invisible is made visible. The supernatural is made manifest in an infant who can do little more than the most natural of movements as he feeds, cries, sleeps. We don't need to wait for Christmas to see God. The work of God is all around us. Those blinded by sin "regain their sight." People overcome backgrounds of poverty and violence to make world-changing contributions. Addicts grow and heal. Truth is spoken, and people listen. Let's pray for the grace to see God's movement in our lives this week. How have you seen the work of God? ©LPi


