# Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14; Psalm 17; 2 Thessalonians 2:16--3:5:

Luke 20:27-38

### Theme: The hope of the resurrection

The idea of life after death are attractive source of stories, novels, and movies. Many famous people have wrestled with the idea of life after death. "if there is no immortality, I shall hurl myself into the sea," wrote Tennyson. Bismarck was calmer, "Without the hope of an afterlife," he said, this life is not even worth the effort of getting dressed in the mourning."

Now, as the end of the Church year arrives in two weeks, it is natural for our thoughts to turn to life after death.

In today's Gospel, the Sadducees, who did not believe in life after death, wanted to show Jesus the absurdity of such a belief, by narrating the story of a woman who was married to seven brothers successively, and all had died without raising an offspring, and in the end the woman too died.

### Jesus Reproved the Sadducees' Ignorance

Jesus said to the Sadducees, "You are wrong because you know neither the Scriptures nor God's power (Mt 22:29)." Jesus presents two arguments.

First, life in the age to come will be different from life as we now know it. Life in the kingdom will be a free gift from God, not something automatic for all in good standing.

Second, the deepest nature of God is life, and that is proof for the reality of resurrected existence. All God's acts of salvation have one ultimate purpose, selfless sharing of that life. Abraham and all faithful descendants must therefore live, or God is not God!

The scripture speaks plainly about the resurrection of the dead. It affirms frequently that there is life after death. Job knew about it. He said, "For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at last he will stand upon the earth; and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then in my flesh I shall see God (19:25-26).

Therefore, Jesus proved to them that there is life after death. When God spoke to Moses, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were still alive. God is God of the living and not of the dead. If Abraham, Isaac and Jacob are still alive, then there is life after death.

#### Jesus Rectified their mistaken views

Jesus rectified their misconception. The Sadducees in their arguments against the belief in resurrection had projected the life of man upon the earth into the life in heaven. They mistakenly thought that, as we get married on earth, we must also get married in heaven. But in heaven, there is no need for marriages because no one dies. There are no births or deaths. In heaven, we shall have a spiritual body and there will be no bodily desires to be satisfied.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta will say, "It is better to think of how best to die than how best to live." Let us all keep our baptismal garment clean till we meet God. Where will you be if you die TODAY? Shalom!

### Stewardship

This is a story about four people named **Everybody**, **Somebody**, **Anybody** and **Nobody**. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was sure that Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody's job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it, but Nobody realized that Everybody wouldn't do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done.

We live in a fast track society where everybody is busy with something. Those with young families have to wrestle with their kids and personal issues for things to fall in place.

There is no doubt that financial demands add responsibility on families and parents. As a result, they have to double up their paycheck to keep the head above water level. While we may have a good reason to explain why we cannot take on additional responsibility, only few people are doing what **everybody** should be doing because **nobody** is interested in what **somebody** or **anybody** should do. We see the same face all the time in various ministries.

I would like to invite you to prayerfully consider which aspect of church life (ushering, lecturing, Extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, Pastoral & Finance Councils, safety and maintenance committee, Catechist/Religious ed instructor, money counters or cantors) you can share your **Time, Talent and Treasure.** 

If you compared your troubles, or challenges with those of others, you would surely find that there are those whose troubles make yours look like minor inconveniences (Catherine Pulsifer).

May our collective efforts help in building the kingdom of God on earth. Remain potent instrument of God!


