Praise the Lord that we are able to have public liturgies again, albeit with the "social distancing" guidelines. We will all work together to do the best we can under the circumstances. As stated in my bulletin column for last weekend, I am adding an extra Saturday evening Mass at 6:30pm for St. Magdalen parish. I shall assess depending on attendance if that is necessary to continue during our current situation.

We are going back to our regular weekday Mass schedule but do keep an eye on future bulletins. There will be times during my final weeks here when there will be adjustments to the weekday schedule whether no Mass scheduled or some at different times from the norm.

Lawrence incoming I thought it realistic to not sign up for that option. Perhaps and hopefully the DREs and various parents of each parish can put their heads together and come up with a day or two summer Catholic program (at least for the lower grade kids) in late summer (July or August).
