Dear Ones,

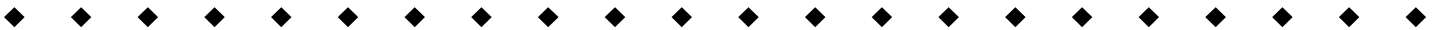
One thing I do each year is to choose different Eucharistic Prayers (the long prayer that starts after the *Holy Holy* and concludes with your *Amen* after I say *Through Him, with Him, in Him...*)

There are different settings for different times. The 1st Eucharistic Prayer is a translation of the Prayer we used all the time until Vatican II. It took older prayers and put them into this form in the late 1500s. The 2nd Prayer is the oldest one we have and was recorded for us by St. Hippolytus in the early 200s. I use this at daily Mass during Ordinary Time and when we have a Baptism on Sundays. The 3rd Eucharistic Prayer is the one we hear most during Ordinary Time. The 4th Prayer is a modern working from the ancient themes we find in all Eucharistic Prayers.

Some time after these four prayers were introduced in 1968 other new prayers were written. Three Eucharistic Prayers for children were added and two Prayers for Reconciliation. Finally, during the papacy of Pope St. John Paul II, the bishops of Switzerland wrote four additional Prayers, each with a unique theme (e.g., Jesus, the Way to the Father.)

During Lent you will be hearing the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation. That is certainly one of the main dynamics of this season as we prepare for Easter. I hope, that as you hear the words of these prayers, you will be drawn closer to God who is at the heart of it all. My prayers for all of you as you continue your Lenten journey.

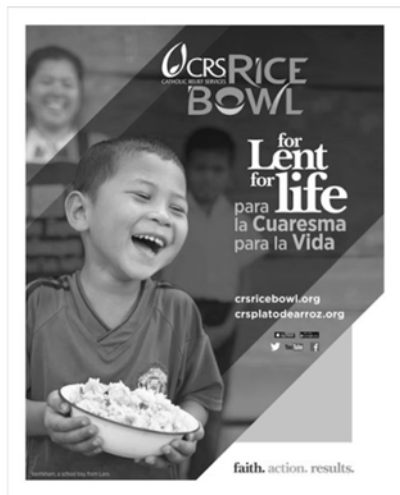

HISTORY OF SALVATION

The first reading today continues the "history of salvation" narrative that we hear throughout Lent this year. Today's story was among the best-loved in the Jewish tradition (surely Joseph told the story to young Jesus as he formed him in the ways of their faith); the early fathers of the Church were very fond of it as a means of explaining the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. The overall tone of the first reading, psalm, and second reading seems a little incongruous with the dazzling Gospel, until we remember that the Transfiguration was placed as the Gospel for this Sunday precisely to remind us of the glory that awaits those who live faithfully and obediently to the will of God. In the life of Jesus, it is a preview of the glory of his resurrection; for us it is a glimpse of the destiny of those who continue, as we heard in last week's Gospel, to repent and believe in the Good News.
