From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This past week and a half that followed Christmas, I engaged members of our Collaborative Pastoral Council, the Finance Councils of both parishes, as well as our staff in an email conversation about whether it was time



to consider suspending public Masses in light of the current state of the pandemic in our area. With unexpectedly light attendance at Christmas Masses, surging virus levels, and the awareness of significant volunteer fatigue, I think the question was a timely one and a good use of our collective ability to sort out and consider the various alternatives that are open to us in response to the issues at hand. I was deeply moved by all of the responses I received, as they have demonstrated not only the deep faith commitment but also the great care and concern that each person had for the people of our parishes and the communities in which we live.

I have to tell you that every time I read a new response, I found myself re-thinking the direction that we need to move in. This must have happened a dozen times or more over the past week. Trying to figure-out a path forward in the midst of these very complex situations was one of the most difficult decisions that I have had to make. And even now, I feel it may be the case that I will need to remake it several times over before all of this is behind us.

Nonetheless, and after careful consideration of all of the thorough advice I received, I would like to take the route of **reducing our weekend schedule** for the time being and be ready to reduce it further or suspend it entirely if circumstances dictate. **Effective the weekend of January 16/17**, we will plan to return the 4:00 p.m. Saturday Vigil Mass to a live-stream experience only, eliminate the 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass at IC and keep one public Sunday Mass in each church: 8:00 a.m. at Nativity in Merrimac, 9:30 a.m. at St. Ann in West Newbury, and 11:30 a.m. at IC in Newburyport. Daily Mass will remain at 9:00 a.m. Monday through Friday at IC. Weddings, Baptisms, and Funerals would remain available as they are now.

Here are my reasons for taking this action:

- A reduction in Masses would take some pressure off of the volunteer pool, which was a major concern in considering this question in the first place. I would also like to see if our volunteers would be willing to serve in multiple churches at different times, possibly expanding our ability to offer coverage at different locations.
- The time between the Christmas Season which ends this weekend with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the beginning of the Lenten Season on February 17 with the celebration of Ash Wednesday is typically a quieter season in our liturgical year, and usually lightly attended, compared to other times of the year. So the reduction in Masses will also reflect that lower demand.
- Although suspending Masses completely would decrease the number of chances of exposure for all of our active parishioners, a reduction in Masses will still work to reduce some of that exposure while preserving the opportunity to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion for those who really want to come.
- Staying open for some limited Masses will keep us in line with what most parishes are currently doing across the Archdiocese. There is a value in maintaining consistency from one parish to another as long as that can be done reasonably and safely.
- The contact-tracing moment that we had from our Christmas and Holy Family weekend Masses indicated that a person present at Mass who might later test positive for COVID does not necessarily mean an actual exposure necessitating a quarantine nor create a virus-spreading situation. If everyone is consistent in following the established safety protocols, (which was the case in this particular situation) they will work to greatly reduce the risk of exposure and spread of this disease. This is by no means a guarantee of absolute safety, but I believe it provides a level of safety that meets or exceeds that which we encounter in other essential areas of life, such as grocery shopping or visiting a doctor's office.
- Our Faith tells us that the Eucharist is meant to be our source and summit of our life in Jesus Christ and Christians in centuries past have made huge and sometimes life-sacrificing efforts to celebrate Mass and practice our Faith. Inasmuch as we are allowed to do so, there is a great value in offering the Eucharist, even in a limited way, if that can be done reasonably and prudently. At present, though not completely without risk, I believe we can.
- The reduced schedule is able to be celebrated logistically by one priest, if others were to become sick, enter into quarantine, or otherwise become unavailable. This could be an important adjustment in the weeks and months ahead.

All of these considerations and the decision to reduce our weekend Mass schedule doesn't preclude further action taken by the State or the Archdiocese as they did back in the spring. If that does happen in the weeks ahead, we will need to adjust to whatever demands are placed upon us.

I continue to be extremely grateful to all of the many volunteers and staff members who have worked so hard to enable us to open our churches, resume and continue our public worship during a scary and uncertain time. Over the months, I have received many, many notes of gratitude from parishioners who have drawn great strength and hope from being able to participate in the Mass: both in-person as well as through our fledgling livestream on social media and our website. Please know that I am committed to doing everything I can to continue this outreach during these challenging days in whatever ways possible. In a month or so as we approach the beginning of our Lenten Season, I will continue this conversation with our Councils and Staff with the hope of eventually adding more weekend Masses and returning our public worship back to include greater participation in song and celebration.

To that end, I would encourage all of you in the months ahead to speak with your healthcare provider and consider receiving the COVID vaccine at your earliest convenience. I believe that our collective embrace of the vaccine along with our continued adherence to all of the existing safety protocols is our surest path forward and out of this dark pandemic valley. For those with health concerns or anyone who lives with or has regular contact with someone who does, I would strongly urge you to stay home and take advantage of our weekly live-streamed Mass which we will continue to work to improve. Now is not the time to let our guard down, but to instead be extra careful to follow all of the public health guidelines that are recommended to us. The dispensation from the obligation attend Mass remains in effect throughout the to pandemic. Please make good choices, not only for yourself, but also for your family and the wider communities in which we live.

I would like to take this moment to invite you to participate in our next Pastoral Council Meeting which will take place on Zoom this coming Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m. Instructions on how to join us are found on page 5 in this issue of our bulletin.

With continued gratitude and prayers for all who have served us so selflessly this past year and with prayers of consolation for those who have suffered loss...let us look ahead to better days.


