

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

The whole point of John's baptism was inclusion: all have sinned and thereby all need to repent in order to open themselves to the new offer of Salvation through Christ. No exceptions! Some of



John's most vitriolic words were reserved for those who didn't think they had sinned or didn't see the need to repent. It was thought by some that a careful following of laws and prescriptions, rules and regulations would make one "righteous" by definition, and in no need of God's mercy or forgiveness. It was precisely by admitting that there was a personal need for forgiveness that a path was opened for a person to experience the new offer of salvation. You had to admit the need in order to proceed.

This was the pathway through the desert and wasteland of sin that the prophets had foretold. By leveling the playing field for all, John the Baptist's preaching brought the high and mighty down and lifted up the lowly. All were equal in the eyes of God: equally loved, equally in need of forgiveness, equally offered a chance for salvation.

It might seem to be a curiosity, then, as to why Jesus submitted to John's Baptism, as He never sinned. Arguably, if there was anyone who didn't need to be forgiven, it was Jesus. He might well have stood on the bank of the Jordan River and shouted to John, "Good work! Keep it up!" But that wasn't who Jesus was.

As St. Paul once wrote: "For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him." (2Cor 5:21) and, "He indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." (2Cor 5:15) Jesus Christ so immersed Himself into our human condition of sin and death that He held nothing back in being one with us, loving us, weeping with us,

suffering for us and even being completely overwhelmed by the scourge of sin: either symbolically in a water bath, or by dying on the cross. He was all-in, right from the beginning.

From the very beginning, Baptism has held the two-fold meaning of dying to one's self, and rising to new life in Christ. We go down into the waters of death, so as to rise from them to the eternal life promised us in Christ. No death? No life. As St. John would later explain it in his Gospel: "John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Jesus said to him in reply, 'Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed him." (Jn 3:14-15)

So what we celebrate today is the completeness of Christ's dedication to His mission from the Father to reconcile all things in Himself. We might well examine our own commitment to Christ through our common baptism. Am I "all in" in my discipleship of the Lord? Do I hold anything or any part of me back, when I look to the task of ongoing conversion and holiness? Is there anything that I wouldn't do for Christ? Am I thoroughly convinced of my need for forgiveness and reconciliation? Where would I be in line at the edge of the Jordan River? First? Last? Somewhere in the middle? Cowering by the riverbank? Or would I be under some shade at a café in the city, chuckling at all those fools who were suffering under the heat of the day for a few minutes in the murky green water? Where are we in our commitment to following Jesus? As we enter into this New Year. 2019. let us renew our dedication to the new life and promise of salvation He came to offer us.

May our New Year be filled with many blessings for us all.
