#### From the Pastor

#### Dear Parishioners,

This past weekend, we had a confluence of unusual events. One priest was away on vacation, another was sick, and a third was required to quarantine due to a COVID exposure. That left me



(unexposed and healthy, yeh!) to celebrate all of the weekend Masses. I did try and reach out to a few other priests in the area to see if anyone might be able to help, but because it was so last-minute, no one was available. Unfortunately, I cannot yet bi-locate (they never taught us that trick in the seminary!) so we had to come up with a Plan B. After consulting with members of our Collaborative Pastoral Council, we decided that in this instance, the best route to follow was have one of our deacons lead a Communion service in place of two of the regular weekend Masses. Since Deacon John Moranski was already prepared to preach anyway, it seemed like an easy thing to ask him to also lead these services, which took place at the 4:00 p.m. at Nativity Church in Merrimac and the 9:00 a.m. at IC Church in Newburyport. I was able to celebrate the remainder of the scheduled Masses. From everything I heard from parishioners over the weekend, all went well.

On Saturday afternoon, in an attempt to notify parishioners of these changes, I sent out a phone message using our new ParishCast system that is connected to our Collaborative database. Approximately 11,000 phone calls were made (by computer) to home and cell phones that were registered with us. Many of you may have received this message. I know from a show of hands at the Masses that I celebrated, that some of you did not. Some of you may have received multiple messages (sorry!) In any event, if you were happy with the notification that you received (or happy that you didn't get it) you need do nothing. If, however, you would like to change the way you receive such messages in the future or make sure that you receive them if this time you did not, please contact our office and speak with Melinda or Linda and they can update our database to better reflect your preferences. We have been trying to use this system sparingly, but it can be helpful to get word out to people if there is a last-minute change or other important message that needs to be shared. Thank you for your help and patience as we improve this system.

The decision to replace a weekend Mass with a Communion service is not ideal, nor necessarily the best option in all circumstances. There is a significant difference, theologically and sacramentally, between a live-celebrated Mass and a Communion service, no matter how similar the two may look on the surface. While both may share an identical Opening Prayer, Liturgy of the Word complete with Homily, a recitation of the Creed and Intercessions, as well *(Continued on page 4)*

as the Lord's Prayer and an opportunity to receive Holy Communion, the Church recognizes a substantial difference in the sacramental action between them.

With a live celebration of the Eucharist, every person present is invited to offer, along with the priest, the gifts of bread and wine, and together ask for the Holy Spirit to sanctify this offering so that these specific gifts of our specific offering (the fruit of our collective prayer) may become the Body and Blood of Christ. Then, we are invited to consume that which we have prayed over, thus completing the sacrifice being offered in the hopes of our becoming what we consume. Through this communal act of worship, the One, True Sacrifice of Calvary is made real and present once again, which is our very source of our redemption in Christ, thus by our sharing in Holy Communion, our sins are forgiven and the promise and pledge of eternal life are confirmed. This is why Mass is such a big deal in the practice of our Catholic Faith! It is the live-action of our offering (with the priest) at Mass that makes God's true and saving presence real for us again and again. When we stop and think about the amazing gift that our live celebration of the Eucharist is, we are deeply blessed by the Lord every time we participate at Mass.

A Communion service, on the other hand does not make this same spiritual connection with Christ's living sacrifice. Of course, there is the blessing of gathering with others for prayer: "Where two or three are gathered, there I am in their midst," (from MT 18:20). Whenever God's Word is proclaimed, it is a living Word, never returning to the Father before it has accomplished all that God intended for it to do. (see Is 55:11) Breaking open that word is certainly beneficial for all present. (see 2Tim 3:16) Our Intercessory prayer together as a gathered-assembly surely is heard by God. (see Jn 14:13) Encountering our Lord's True Presence in the reserved Sacrament is always a blessing.

It's not that any of this is bad or unhelpful in any way. If this is all that we are capable of on a given day, we are truly blessed by the Lord! But it falls short of the much richer spiritual and sacramental blessing present in the Mass. At Mass, we consume what we have prayed over-in other words the fruit of our prayer is our sharing in the One Bread and One Chalice. At a Communion service, we only share in the fruit of someone else's sacrifice, the fruit of someone else's prayer. Same Lord? Yes! Same spiritual effect? No. This is not to say that God doesn't bless us through our sharing in the reserved Sacrament. No one can limit what God will do for the salvation of all. But our Church understands these circumstances very differently and never wants to see a Communion service (which may be lead by clergy or trained-laity alike) take the regular place of Sunday Mass.

There is a very earnest desire on the part of the Church that the direct connection between our offering and our consuming what has been offered be maintained, that even in the live celebration of the Eucharist, we are not supposed to draw from the Tabernacle to offer Communion during that celebration. There are, of course exceptions to this—such as when we have a very large number of people present and we run out of hosts that have been consecrated specifically for that Mass, or on the rare moment when we have so many leftover hosts from previous Masses, that they need to be consumed lest they grow stale or become spoiled. But these exceptions should be rare. The main purpose of the Tabernacle is to reserve the Blessed Sacrament so that it may be taken to the sick at a later time. A secondary purpose that came about much later in our Christian history is to allow for prayer and adoration before the Real Presence outside of Mass to develop and encourage a hunger for the live celebration of the Eucharist. Dead-last, and the result of an aberration from the past century and more, is to intentionally store hosts so that they can be distributed during Mass. For all the reasons listed above, this is the least-desirable way to receive Holy Communion if a live celebration is otherwise conveniently available.

We chose to allow Communion services this weekend because there was concern that we could not properly communicate in time to everyone who was planning to attend the affected services and that for some people, this might represent the only opportunity they had over the weekend to worship and receive Holy Communion. With greater advance notice, greater opportunities exist for people to adjust their schedules accordingly to celebrate the Eucharist. Because we have been blessed with such a "deep bench" of clergy in our Collaborative, it is my hope that we will not have to make this kind of choice again anytime soon, and if it is known earlier in the week, we may decide to cancel a particular Mass or combine the weekend schedule instead of substituting it with a Communion service. But this past weekend, this seemed to be our best option, and I hope that those who chose to attend these services found them to be helpful and a source of blessing for you and your family.

OK, too much theology! Time to go watch the Patriots!

### **Face Masks Required**

#### January 6 Update



The Archdiocese of Boston is requiring all people attending public Masses to wear a face mask for the duration of the service. Children under the age of 5 are not required to wear masks. Children under the age of 2 should not wear masks.

This applies to weekend Masses as well as Funerals, Weddings, Baptisms, and any indoor prayer services. This requirement will be in place **until at least March 3** (Thursday after Ash Wednesday). Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
