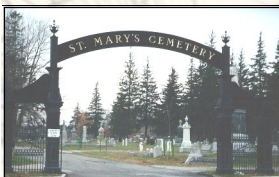

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's Gospel contains a curious line that is repeated in its description of how Jesus taught: "He taught as one having authority and not as the Scribes..." I've always wondered exactly what that must have been like. Was it the inflection of His voice that gave Jesus "authority?" Over the years when I was growing up, my mother yelled at me for many reasons, (most of them justified.) But I could always tell from the tone in her voice whether she was yelling at me because that was what she did, or she was yelling at me because she really meant it! There was a difference..., subtle though it may have been. Ignore the former, and I'd probably just get yelled at some more, but ignore the latter...well...the full weight of her authority over me would have come down like a ton a bricks, crushing any hope of not getting grounded and sending me to my room to stew and consider my failures and mistakes! Now THAT was authority! OK, a little melodramatic hyperbole here...but you get the point.



Still, there is more to authority than simply the ability to raise your voice or express the seriousness of your cause. It also has to do with fully knowing that of which you are speaking about. On many different occasions, I recall Fr. Broderick telling stories about his military service during World War II. He served as the bombardier on a B-24 Liberator heavy bomber, having flown numerous missions over Germany with the U.S. Army Air Corps. A bit of a history buff myself, I had done much reading and study about that war. From them, I knew quite a bit about the different battles that were fought, the various ships, planes, tanks and equipment that were involved and the differing peoples and nations that fought during it. I imagine that I could give a fairly detailed presentation about many different aspects of that time period. But I obviously never lived through it. I built a plastic scale model of a B-24 when I was a kid. He actually flew in one!

In listening to Fr. Broderick's stories, it was evident that he had seen and experienced many things. He knew what it felt like to be squeezed into the claustrophobic nose of an airplane, what the odor of hydraulic fluid smelled like, what it meant to see empty seats back at their ready room after a mission was complete. He recalled how much his lieutenant cursed and drank and smoked. He described the feelings of utter terror and the naïve confidence that washed over him with equal measure. He spoke of the puzzling guilt he felt

for having survived something that so many others had not. With sublime nuances, he talked about the brazen swagger of a nineteen-year-old dealing with the crushing realities of death and suffering and loss. In other words...he spoke with the authority of one who had really been there and whose life was fundamentally altered because of it. It was heart-knowledge, not just head-knowledge.

It is in this same sense that I think we need to understand Jesus' authority in His teachings. It's not just that Jesus knew what he was talking about, but also that Jesus knew WHO he was sharing: namely, His own real, lived-out relationship with God His Father. This is the relationship that commands respect. This is the relationship that with the greatest of strength can move our hearts with the gentlest of words. This is the relationship that defines everything else, because it is an intimate connection with the One who was and is and ever will be, the very author of life itself, the Creator of the Universe. No wonder the evil spirits even obeyed this kind of authority. No wonder the people of Jesus' time recognized in their souls that His teaching was something different, something new, something to be listened to!

We are bearers in this same authority when we share our own lived-out relationship with God. No matter how fleeting or tentative we might feel it is, when we offer our own experience of God, it has its own authority or ability to get people's attention...to capture their hearts. Our Baptismal call is to share that lived-out relationship with the Lord with others, not keep it to ourselves. Because when we do, God can work through our words and testimony to accomplish many things in those who hear them.

So, let's give witness, let's share our stories of what God is up to in our lives, of what God has helped us with or accomplished for us. Our real, true encounters with the Lord have their own ability to gather other's attention and invite them deeper into that same relationship that brings us hope, joy and new life. His name is Jesus! Let us listen to Him more closely, now that He has our attention.

At-Home Lenten Retreat

**Jesus, Wounded Healer Perfected Through Suffering:
Exploring the transforming role of suffering in
Jesus' life and your own**

Scripture will guide our retreat. "Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered; and when he was made perfect, he became the source of eternal life for all who obey him." Heb. 5: 8-9

Jesus the Christ, our wounded healer, calls to us in this time of suffering. We are wounded and desire healing. Following Jesus through our Lenten retreat we will stay awake with Jesus as he is wounded and suffers for us. We will give thanks for his great love and salvific suffering as we explore our own suffering and its transforming power. Responding to his love, we may allow Jesus to enter through our own wounds, heal us with his saving love, and be transformed. We, too, may become wounded healers to our world as His healing love flows through us to others.



Retreat packet materials will support learning through Scripture and offer teachings of Richard Rhor, Cynthia Bourgeault, Marcus Borg, Joan Chittister, Paul Coutinho SJ, Carlo Charrette, St. Ignatius of Loyola, Julien of Norwich, Henri Nouwen, Pope John Paul II, and others as well as poems, prayers, and questions for reflection. Ponder and share with God what touches you. Stay awake and open to God's response. Bring your experiences of God to spiritual direction.

Connecting with the Christ's many forms of suffering through prayer, reading, reflection, group sharing, and individual spiritual direction you will be aided to name and explore your own experiences of suffering and desire for healing. You will have opportunities for three individual one-hour sessions of spiritual direction by phone or zoom scheduled at your convenience.

This retreat is designed to be affordable, convenient, and safe. It will begin with a group Zoom meeting to discuss the retreat's theme and prepare you for our Lenten journey. The fourth week Zoom meeting will include teaching and time to share reflections and responses to material read and support each other as the retreat continues. 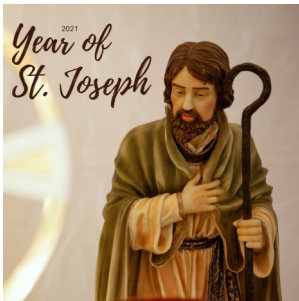

Centering Prayer and Lectio Divina

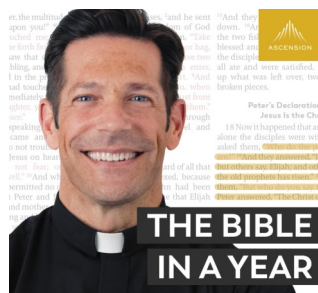

Ecumenical Candlelight Taizé Meditation Service

Live Streamed

On Sunday, January 31, at 7:00 p.m., you are invited to attend a candlelight meditation service live-streamed on the [Groveland Congregational Church Facebook page](#), and also available afterward for viewing. The program will also be available for printing on the Facebook page.

The theme of this month's service is "Behold, I make all things new!" As we begin a new year, we hope and pray for justice, peace, respect, and kindness. We pray for the guidance of God's spirit. The service is modeled after those held at the Taizé community in France, with prayer, song, scripture, petitions, and silence.

Taizé prayer is a simple form of ecumenical Christian prayer centered on scripture, silence and song. It involves singing and listening to the word of God in an atmosphere of silence and peace. The worship space will be illuminated with a multitude of candles; the music will consist of simple repeated refrains, enabling the worshippers to enter into prayer. There will be readings from scripture, petitions, and a time of silent prayer.

Why not give yourself the gift of these few moments of calm and peace in God's presence!

The Scripture passages read each day at Mass will no longer be posted in the bulletin. Instead, they can be found online at bible.usccb.org the site of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops. There you will find the daily readings, be able to listen to them on podcast, and have the opportunity to watch a short reflection piece on the readings offered by a Catholic priest, deacon, religious, or lay person.

Praying with the Scriptures daily is a wonderful way to deepen our relationship with Our Lord and to discern how best to serve God as an intentional disciple of Christ. 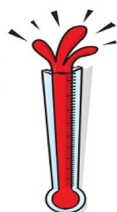

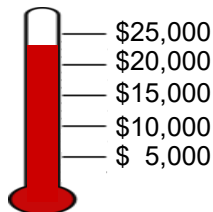
