

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As our Christmas festivities come to a close, we are given this one last exciting feast of the Baptism of the Lord to send us forward into the months ahead. Originally celebrated within the context of



Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord is a reminder, once again, of Christ's self-emptying and humility. Though He had no sin, He made himself like sin to fully embrace our human condition before God, so that there is not any aspect of our human life that is not redeemed.

As Hippolytus of Rome once wrote in the Third Century, "Pay close attention now, I beg you, for I want to return to the fountain of life and contemplate its healing waters at their source. The Father of immortality sent his immortal Son and Word into the world; he came to us to cleanse us with water and the Spirit. To give us a new birth that would make our bodies and souls immortal, he breathed into us the Spirit of life and armed us with incorruptibility." ~from the Sermon on the Holy Manifestation

It is also with the understanding found in the text of the Collect and prayer from the Fourth Sunday of Easter (known frequently as "Good Shepherd Sunday"): "Almighty ever-living God, lead us to a share in the joys of heaven, so that the humble flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before." Meaning that Christ has first modeled for us a way of holiness and carved a pathway of humility and repentance for us to follow. The prayer over the offerings for that Sunday continue: "That we may always find delight in these paschal mysteries, so that the renewal constantly at work within us may be the cause of our unending joy." In other words, repentance leads to conversion of heart and an openness to the gift of reconciliation. This is the very source of our promise of new life in Christ.

For Christ to descend into the Jordan river, He symbolized His own death for us all because of our sins. His rising from the waters of Baptism embodied our own hope for resurrection and rising to new life with Him.

This weekend, let us give thanks for the gift of our own Baptism and its promise of eternal life!

Note: If a Friday funeral is scheduled, or in the absence of a presider, IC Church will




