From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

At first glance, the parable from this weekend's Gospel appears to portray a king (often the "God" figure in a parable) as being psychotic and unstable. He lays out a great wedding feast, and when the invited guests refuse to come, he orders



his servants to bring and even drag in anyone they find so that the banquet feast will not go to waste, but then has the nerve to criticize one of those late-comer guests for not wearing a wedding garment? Give me a break! The poor guest was just dragged in from the street, and gets criticized for his lack of festive clothing? How is that possibly fair? Is this the way God will treat us? What kind of terrifying message is being given here?

Using our modern understanding of what a wedding guest is and does in order to be part of the celebration, this parable seems to fall apart into absurdity. However, add this one little detail that would have been widely known and understood in Jesus' time: the "Wedding Garments" would have been provided at the door. Because this was a royal wedding and even the wealthiest of invited guests would have struggled to afford a garment that was opulently decorative and worthy of the special event, the king would have known this in advance and thus from the great depths of the royal treasury would have provided appropriate festal garments for everyone who came in.

The secret to this story is that the man who was kicked out had refused to wear the wedding garment offered to him at the door. For whatever reason, he refused something freely offered, intending to enjoy the feast on his own terms. He turned down a great gift and in doing so, ended up losing his place at the banquet.

With this little detail in place, the lesson of the parable comes into sharp focus: the wedding feast is the Kingdom of Heaven. Those originally invited to that feast refused to come when called. God then opened the doors to any and all who would enter, but with the one requirement that they wear a wedding garment—a symbol of our baptismal call to holiness. All are welcome, but you must wear the baptismal garment of a commitment to serving the Lord. The rewards and blessings of the Kingdom are enormous, but the call to service must be taken seriously.

Over the years, many have tried to figure out ways to "earn their way" into Heaven. How much must I give, how many times must I forgive, how much must I love....But the reality from the very beginning has always been that we already possess the Kingdom of Heaven. It has been given to us without cost. It is a pure gift from God. The challenge is to completely accept that gift beyond all measure, to hold onto

2020-2021 CORI

If you are a volunteer you must fill out a <u>C</u>riminal <u>O</u>ffender Record Information Form every year.

The Archdiocese of Boston requires all clergy, all parish staff (full and part-time), and all volunteers (18 years of age and older) who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly, or the disabled will undergo an annual CORI check.

No matter what you volunteer to do, if your duties are carried out on parish property, or under the parish name, you must be CORI-ed every year.

From the Book of Revelation we hear:

"Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory. For the wedding day of the Lamb has come, his bride has made herself ready. She was allowed to wear

a bright, clean linen garment."

(The linen represents the righteous deeds of the holy ones.)

Then the angel said to me,

"Write this: Blessed are those who have been called to the wedding feast of the Lamb."

(Rev. 19: 7-9)

In consideration of our great hope in Jesus Christ to enter into the great banquet feast of Heaven, let us recommit ourselves in our Baptism to ever better serving the Lord through our care and concern for one another. Although God seems to have great patience for those who might be "fashionably late," He has no tolerance for those who refuse to wear the garment of humble service. Let's make sure we are appropriately dressed—now and in the life to come!
