From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

These days, it is hard to deal with anything related to technology without also attending to cybersecurity. Everything needs a password... substantial ones at that! Encryption is necessary. Two-factor authentication is a must. Biometrics: fingerprint, face-



recognition and even iris-scanning have been imbedded into everyday devices like our cell phones. VPN's are de-rigueur. Multiple forms of backups, including using the Cloud, are essential. All this, to avoid being "hacked" and having your data held for ransom by cybercriminals who will demand payment to release your precious electrons. Nothing can shut down operations quicker than being locked out of your own computers!

When faced with such a calamity and because of the extreme complexities involved, many cities, towns, hospitals, corporations, and businesses have chosen to pay the cash ransom, as it is often cheaper and easier than trying to fight back against this kind of crime. The criminals have become savvy, too, not charging "unreasonable" amounts for ransom and being careful, once paid, to actually release their victims' data, lest their somewhat-unsullied "reputations" be tarnished. There is nothing so unreliable as an unreliable criminal, I guess!

The whole idea of paying a ransom to release something or someone of value is not new. There are many stories going back into antiquity of famous people being held for ransom—perhaps Julius Caesar the most noteworthy. Whether you are dealing with a brutal kidnapping or a vicious cyberattack, the most frustrating thing with paying a ransom, is that it is often the only way to secure a safe release of the item or person in question. Wars can be waged, special forces can be unleashed upon our enemies, counterterrorism, and our own cyber warfare capabilities can hit back against such injustice. But it is often the reality that it is cheaper, more cost-effective, and just plain safer to simply pay the ransom and hope for the best. The practical is sometimes clothed in the apparent defeat.

But enter the realm of the divine, and the scales of justice change. When God is offended by a sinful humanity, we incur a debt that no human being nor our race as a whole left to ourselves—could ever pay back. The ransom we would have to pay, to return our fallen humanity back to its created State of Grace that existed before the Fall, is, simply, infinite. Offend an infinite deity, merit an infinitely-high ransom to be released from the clutches of sin and death.

Now God never really put it that way to us lowly humans, but our philosophers and theologians over the centuries

have used this "ransomware" calculation to help us understand what Jesus did for us by His death on the Cross. His "payment" for our sins was of ultimate and infinite value because, a). He is God (infinite) and b). He never sinned (thus, He is doing this completely altruistically—all for us and not for Himself in any way.) So, Jesus' sacrifice was the one ransom that could be paid for us to find forgiveness for ours sins and have the hope of eternal life restored.

And the sole motive for God doing this is: love. Recall the slogan seen at practically any football game when fans raise a sign in the stadium with this reference, "John 3:16," which is, *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."* God paid the ransom for us. Looked at in this light, only God could afford to pay such a lofty sum. As a Christian Church, you might think that we should be eternally shamed by the need for God to have intervened on our behalf, and yet, even the shame of our having had our sins forgiven is wiped away in the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Thus, on our holiest night of the year, we even dare to refer to our gift of salvation thusly:

This is the night,

when Christ broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld.

O wonder of your humble care for us! O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!

O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!

O happy fault

that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!

(from the Exsultet at the Easter Vigil celebration)

It is only to underscore and place extra emphasis on just how amazing and gracious God is, that we ever call our sin, "necessary," or our fault, "happy." What God has given us in Jesus Christ goes beyond the beyond. Superlatives at this point all fail at describing God's love and kindness towards us. An immeasurable ransom has been paid, and there is nothing but joy and peace that follows. Even our regret is swept away by the sheer excellence of our redemption. God is just too good!

So, our Scriptures this weekend speak of Jesus coming to serve the Will of God and to give His life as ransom for the many. Thus, God was well-pleased in His faithful and selfless service.

In gratitude then, we are called to imitate Christ's loving example of mercy, forgiveness, and compassion knowing that while our own meager efforts at holiness will never approach that of our Savior, the very act of trying brings joy to God who has first loved us. So let us give it our best effort, confident in God's love for us.

Oh, and by the way...back up your computer every once in a while. The cyber criminals aren't so gracious as our Lord, or as forgiving!

Immaculate Conception School



The pandemic has challenged educators to provide children with an education in a safe environment, exposing the capacities of school systems to flex to a new normal. More than ever, parents are questioning school choice and want to know about the options

available for their children. Catholic schools were especially nimble at responding to the pandemic, keeping their doors open while large public school districts took months to figure it out. Immaculate Conception School will be part of a new educational series created by the public television show *Viewpoint with Dennis Quaid* which will feature private elementary and secondary schools. Last week the IC was visited by a film crew from *Viewpoint* who spent the day filming our students and faculty. The final tv segment will be a 5–6 minute documentary that will be televised nationally starting in January.

The IC will own all the footage captured during filming to use for marketing purposes. *Viewpoint* will provide an adapted version of the final documentary that is edited specifically for our school website. Additional soundbites and shorter film segments will add to our marketing message.

As you can imagine, the IC community invested a great deal of time and energy in preparing for last week's filming. The school looked beautiful thanks to our entire team! Individual interviews with a cross section of school community members contributed to the message we shared about the benefits of a faith-based education. We can't wait to see the final cut and hope that families across the country will look at Catholic schools as a worthy alternative for their children.
