From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As we continue to move through these days of a pandemic, I have found myself celebrating many individual baptisms (as opposed to large, group celebrations) for safety reasons. Although I try to mix it up, I often end up using this weekend's



Gospel for the Scripture Reading during the brief Baptismal liturgy.

Reflecting on this rather simple passage, I regularly lament that Jesus wasn't asked a more difficult question. After all, what is He going to say when queried about what the greatest commandment of the Law was? Love God, love neighbor. Not exactly rocket science, now is it? But dive deeper into this question and we see something more interesting come into focus. If we stick to the traditional "10 Commandments," well, then the question seems rather straightforward. But if we look at the fact that during Jesus' time, many rabbis frequently looked to the first five books of the Bible as containing the complete Torah or Law of God, then you will see that while there certainly are the traditional 10 Commandments as we would know them today there. . . but there were also 603 other commandments as well. And here is where it gets fun! Can you imagine trying to remember all 613 Commandments every day? I don't think I would be able to even make it out of bed in the morning without violating one or more of them somehow. Thus the now, oh-so-human question, of which is the greatest, just in case, you know, we don't get around to all 613 of them.

In a sense, Jesus entertains a vital human question of how do I stay close to God in the midst of my own imperfections and failures? Try to follow every prescription of the Law, dot every "i," cross every "t," and it is easy to miss something. (Continued on page 4)

If you are a volunteer you must fill out a \underline{C} riminal \underline{O} ffender \underline{R} ecord Information Form every year.

The Archdiocese of Boston requires all clergy, all parish staff (full and part-time), and all volunteers (18 years of age and older) who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly, or the disabled will undergo an annual CORI check.

No matter what you volunteer to do, if your duties are carried out on parish property, or under the parish name, you must be CORI-ed every year.

But Jesus' answer invokes the resilience of the human spirit when He invites us to love God with all of our heart, soul and strength, and our neighbor as ourself. In other words, if you do your very best to love God with everything you got—in your actions, in your thoughts, in the depths of who you are, and also do your very best to love your neighbor—those who are in proximity to you at any given moment, those who journey through life with you, those who you are in relationship with . . . then you will indeed be very close to God. This leaves room for improvement, for we can always love more, love better, love smarter. Yet it casts a pathway of grace through life that can be easily grasped and richly followed.

Yes, go for the 613 if you can. But never lose sight of who we are called to love in this world or why. This doesn't mean that love is always easy. Our own painful life experience tells us otherwise. The ultimate act of love that Jesus offered us in this world was His sacrifice on the Cross—an act of suffering and bitterness that brought life to the world. Sometimes our loving God and neighbor entails our own path of suffering and pain. Yet if it is done in faithfulness to God's Commandments of love, they will not end in defeat or loss, but will triumph to new life.

Every effort we make to fulfill God's Law of love brings us that much closer to the mystery of our Creator and the promise of the Kingdom of Heaven. Whether we are brandnew at following the Lord, or slightly more experienced, we can all take direction and encouragement from Jesus' words today.

May the Lord bless each of us on our journey to God.

IC Haiti Update

We are blessed to report that the impacts of the COVID-19 virus in Haiti have been minimal compared to other regions of the world, including the United States. We received an update from Puit Chacha earlier this month that the school is up and running.

Like schools here, the Fr. Marc Piché elementary school in Chacha closed for classes back in March. St. Boniface Hospital's community health team immediately began to conduct education sessions around Chacha, with participants that included the school staff. In July, the students started returning once each week to pick up nutrition assistance kits as well as homework packets to complete. Fortunately, now that students are back for inperson learning, the school's classrooms have the space to accommodate social distancing. It should be noted the school staff worked diligently to source masks, additional chairs, disinfecting supplies, and materials for additional handwashing stations throughout the space.

Throughout the time of the pandemic, the hospital health team has been consulting with the school on effective distancing measures, proper hygiene, and infection control protocols, including a process for referring symptomatic students to the hospital for testing. Thus far, there haven't been any infections at the school. The hospital's community outreach program will continue to monitor the Chacha community for symptoms of an outbreak.

There are 164 students attending school at Chacha this semester. 176 children are enrolled but 12 did not return after the COVID-19 closure. It's anticipated that they will return for the spring semester in November. In addition, there are graduates of the Fr. Marc elementary school who are attending secondary school in Fond des Blanc. The move up to secondary school has been made possible by tuition scholarships provided by IC Haiti.

As a community of faith, let us continue to keep the community of Puit Chacha, Haiti, in our thoughts and prayers. Our parish's financial support, even during a time of pandemic when parishioners' own financial situations have been sorely strained, has kept hope alive in the Chacha community by continuing to make education and health services available. Thanks be to God for sustaining us in this ministry.

Immaculate Conception School



Delivering instruction in school settings cannot be accomplished in this pandemic without the effective use of technology. Immaculate Conception School utilizes several types of devices to connect the learning with students in the classroom and at home. Large desktop

Chrome Bases were repurposed in classrooms from the Computer Lab since communal spaces, such as labs, cannot be used under COVID guidelines. These devices are used by teachers to communicate with students who are learning from home.

A grid screen enables the teacher to see every child while the camera allows the children to see the teacher. The big screen Promethean boards are used as interactive chalkboards. At various points in a lesson, the teacher can share the big screen with the students at home which allows them to see what the teacher is writing and presenting in real time.

Small cameras that swivel and tilt, *pictured right*, are also used, which adds another layer of connection for the children learning at home.


