Update Your Collaborative Registration Information

The Pastoral Council has been working on upgrading the software used by the Collaborative which will allow better communication to parishioners through email, voicemail and text. We will be testing the new software in the coming weeks. As we iron out any "bugs" in the system, you may get more than one message from Fr. Tim depending upon the contact preferences you established when you registered with the parish. Once you receive the message or messages, please contact the office to update your preferences for future contact.

We look forward to using this new system to advise of Mass schedule changes, meeting cancellations due to weather, and other important Collaborative-wide communications. Thank you for your patience as we work through the launch of this new system.

Holy Communion in the Hand

One COVID-related restriction we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to *receive Holy Communion only in the hand*. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.

Members of our Collaborative have experienced a wide range of emotions during the COVID 19 pandemic—some profoundly sad through the loss of a loved one; loss of employment; remote education; and the inability to celebrate graduations, weddings, proms and family events. Others have experienced some surprisingly positive occurrences—increased family contact through "Zoom" and "Facetime," a slower pace to day to day life, a more intense prayer life, and many examples of humanity at its best.

Perhaps memorializing YOUR experiences throughout the pandemic will assist your reflections and encourage your children to express their impressions, fears, and feelings.

An enlightening history of parishioners' observations to be circulated in subsequent years as a way to remember this unprecedented event in our lives.

St. Francis of Assisi

We celebrate St. Francis of Assisi this weekend, one of the most beloved saints. Born in 1811, he abandoned a comfortable life in order to follow the life of Christ. He quickly developed a reputation for his kindness and help to the most marginalized in society and for his deep love of animals and the environment, embracing all of God's creation. He was canonized in 1226.

Pope John Paul II declared him the patron saint of ecologists and encouraged us to follow the example of St. Francis by "embracing all creatures as members of a single family and by offering respect, dignity, and care to each family member."

"In 1979, I proclaimed Saint Francis of Assisi as the heavenly Patron of those who promote ecology (*cf. Apostolic Letter Inter Sanctos: AAS 71 [1979], 1509f.*). He offers Christians an example of genuine and deep respect for the integrity of creation. As a friend of the poor who was loved by God's creatures, Saint Francis invited all of creation—animals, plants, natural forces, even Brother Sun and Sister Moon—to give honour and praise to the Lord. The poor man of Assisi gives us striking witness that when we are at peace with God we are better able to devote ourselves to building up that peace with all creation which is inseparable from peace among all peoples."

"It is my hope that the inspiration of Saint Francis will help us to keep ever alive a sense of 'fraternity' with all those good and beautiful things which Almighty God has created. And may he remind us of our serious obligation to respect and watch over them with care, in light of that greater and higher fraternity that exists within the human family."*

We pray to St. Francis for the courage to follow his example in our care of the earth, of all of God's creatures, and one another.


