



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This was a tragedy! The vineyard trampled and given over to pasture?! It will be overgrown with thorns and briers and become an arid wasteland?! This was unthinkable, a death-blow to the community!



In ancient times, there were few worse things for a villagecommunity to endure than the loss of a cherished vineyard. This was not simply an epicurean tragedy for the few foodies in their midst, but a genuine loss for everyoneman, woman, and child. You see, the vineyard was so much more than a place to get the occasional grape to munch on or turn-to for the source of an infrequent glass of wine. Rather, the vineyard was the very symbol of life itself and of God's blessing upon their families. Aside from providing the raw material to make the prized "fruit of the vine," the vineyard also employed most of the village at one point or another. While workers would toil year-round, pruning, fertilizing, watering, digging-all to position the vines in the best possible light to receive the rain from Heaven and the essential sunlight—when it came to harvest time, everyone was called into the field to help reap the grapes, as they all ripened at once.

The collective community effort unified the people around a single task that was always seen to be in cooperation with God's blessings upon their land. Hence, the wine that was produced was a powerful symbol of God's favor upon their community and a promise of His enduring love. Handed down over centuries, incorporated into Jewish rituals, embraced by the Lord Jesus and sacramentalized at the Last Supper, the Cup of Blessing was a potent sign of God's saving presence.

Thus the tragedy—no vineyard, no work, no grapes, no wine...no blessing from the Lord! How awful! And all because those who were tasked with the vineyard's upkeep—those who would prune and hoe and water and fertilize—all because they failed in their duties and became lax in their responsibilities. God did God's part: God provided rain and sunshine and good soil. God provided for the changing of seasons, a time for planting and a time for harvesting. But the vineyard did not produce good fruit, only wild grapes. Something was rotten, indeed!

Isaiah names it well: bloodshed and an outcry for missing justice. Matthew picks up the theme as Jesus tells this weekend's parable of greed, injustice, murder, and wretchedness. It is the sad story of human sin and failure all woven into a simple story of a landowner—a friend!, wanting nothing more than His proper share of grapes at harvest time. He didn't even want all the grapes, only His share. In an abundant harvest, there would be plenty to go around for everyone. The landowner only wanted His proper share, something that we observers across the centuries can see as eminently fair. Even an absentee landlord would be due His just share; after all, He paid for the land the vineyard was planted on, paid for the improvements, paid for the workers to make the

2020-2021 CORI

If you are a volunteer you must fill out a <u>Criminal Offender</u> Record Information Form every year.

The Archdiocese of Boston requires all clergy, all parish staff (full and part-time), and all volunteers (18 years of age and older) who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly, or the disabled will undergo an annual CORI check.

No matter what you volunteer to do, if your duties are carried out on parish property, or under the parish name, you must be CORI-ed every year.

improvements. If people weren't faithful to their obligations and commitments because of their pay and share of the harvest, surely they would do so because this is the vineyard of a friend. But alas, that is the price of sin—and alienation from all that is good, a destruction of the very fabric of friendship and love.

Like last week's Parable of the Two Sons, this Parable of the Vineyard points to God's earnest and passionate desire for good fruit. God really, really, really wants a good harvest! He doesn't want us to simply talk about it, conjecture about what it might look like or ponder the merits of potentially bringing forth the occasional grape. No, God wants the rich, abundant harvest that ought to always be there due to the good soil and good sunlight and good rain. The only thing more that is needed is the faithful toil and labor to bring it about.

Faithfulness. There it is again—a call from the Lord through the sacred stories passed down over centuries that invites us to turn from sin and follow a path of holiness. What human sin and failure have ruined, God renews and redeems through Jesus Christ.

Just as differing varieties of grapes are carefully grown in particular soils to make unique wines that are a lasting expression of their local climates and cultures, so God calls forth from each of us and from our collective communities of faith a vintage that ought to be a lasting blessing not only for ourselves but, indeed, for all who long to share in what is an overabundance of God's Grace.

St. Francis of Assisi sought to follow a path of conversion that made him a better and more faithful worker in the vineyard of his Friend. May we open our hearts this weekend on his Feast Day to do the same.


