From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's Gospel passage is often referred to as the "The Parable of the Talents." Now a "talent" was a measure of money, worth somewhere around 10,000 days' wages. So, looking at the minimum wage and before any taxes



would be taken out, let's call it a cool million dollars in today's money. That's quite a stack of cash, no matter what century you are living in! As we listen to this story, we see the industrious servants being praised as they were able to double their allotted portions and the third, uncreative servant chastised and cast-out for failing to at least return the money with interest. This reading of the Gospel gels with our own modern values of entrepreneurship and free trade. Good for them, we cheer, as the first two servants make fistfuls of money! Maybe we feel bad for the third servant who was not as creative or adventurous, but there is a little voice deep down inside that nags at us saying, "He at least could have tried to do something, couldn't have he?" That the third servant is thrown outside where there will be wailing and gnashing of teeth seems a fitting punishment. After all, a million bucks buried in the dirt wasn't earning any interest. What a shameful, lost opportunity, we might think....

So, was Jesus really praising free market capitalism? Did he really want His disciples to be investors and stock brokers? What is going on here?

We think nothing today of promoting the idea of creating wealth and growing our investments. This is the way it is done. The more creative we are, the greater the reward is. Through careful, shrewd investing over time, we compound interest, we build wealth, we grow rich. All of this is seen as good and normal. It is solid financial planning for the future.

Not so in Jesus' time! For the hearers of Matthew's Gospel, money and wealth were fixed commodities. In other words, there was only a certain amount of it in the world, and it has already been distributed. If you were to gain more of it somehow, it meant that someone else had lost it, perhaps through dishonest means. Thus, gaining wealth was seen as suspicious and shameful. One ought to be satisfied with what they have, not seeking to gain more at someone

else's expense. There was honor in being content with what one had, with one's position and station in life. To reach for more was repulsive...and even sinful. So looking at this story from this perspective, which of the three servants acted honorably? The one who buried the money and returned it to the ruthless master without "mis-using" it. Remember, even putting the money out for a loan and getting it back with interest risked being seen as usury. The honorable path here was not to do anything with the money but to return it to its proper owner and have nothing to do with the other's questionable methods.

In the Scriptures, Jesus is always portrayed as acting honorably. And here is where the twist comes in! While on the surface, Jesus seems to be championing the dishonorable actions of making money off of others (much to the initial horror of his followers) Jesus' true honor comes not from his handling of earthly things according to earthly customs, but rather the real honor comes from God His Father. Jesus always acts honorably by being about His Father's business. True honor lies in doing God's Will. True honor and lasting wealth is found in seeking the things of God, even if those things are not understood or valued by others.

Thus, in this story, although the master is portrayed as a demanding person, harvesting where he did not plant and gathering where he did not scatter, the lesson that Jesus is offering for us is that real wealth (honor) comes doing the master's will. Particularly when we don't understand it, and even if we find it distasteful. God will not be contained by our mere human understanding of what God "ought" to be doing or where God "should" be acting. God will be demanding from time to time, at least from our perspective. What is being praised in the first two servants was their loyalty to totally orienting their lives and actions to be in accord with that of their master.

And although the third servant appeared to act honorably according to earthly virtue, he failed miserably in making his heart one with his master and ultimately found himself in disdain of everything his master stood for. Our heroes are not necessarily God's heroes. The only real, true, lasting virtue is to make our hearts completely docile to God's Will and conform our hearts' desire to His. There and only there will we find life, happiness, and peace.

In the words of the familiar song,

Seek ye first the Kingdom of God And His righteousness And all these things shall be added unto you Allelu Alleluia

May these autumnal days yield rich blessings for us all from the Lord.

2020-2021 CORI

If you are a volunteer you must fill out a <u>Criminal Offender</u> Record Information Form every year.

The Archdiocese of Boston requires all clergy, all parish staff (full and part-time), and all volunteers (18 years of age and older) who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly, or the disabled will undergo an annual CORI check.

No matter what you volunteer to do, if your duties are carried out on parish property, or under the parish name, you must be CORI-ed every year.

Please see your Ministry Leader, a Deacon, or a Priest for a CORI form. It must be completed and your identity verified, then placed in the collection box, or mail it to the CORI Coordinators: Deacon Paul Dow and Maureen Dow to:
