From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

"What is truth?" These are the next words in the Gospel, if you were to keep reading from the passage that we were given this weekend. They were famously spoken by Pontius Pilate, in his interrogation of Jesus prior to sentencing Him to death.



Most of us Christians over the years have interpreted his words in an ironic sort of way—that when faced with Truth-embodied in Jesus Christ, Pilate could not embrace the truth of who was before him. And yet, if we look at his actual words in the Gospel—he gets it more right than he realizes. Pilate goes on to say, "I find no guilt in him." (Jn 18:39). Even as he is about to give in to the will of the mob assembled before him, Pilate presents the now-scourged Jesus: "Behold your King." (Jn 19:14). Although weak and unprincipled, Pilate nonetheless speaks the truth about Jesus, though it makes little claim on his heart or actions.

And maybe that is the point of what Jesus was proclaiming earlier—that He came to testify to the truth, and anyone who belongs to the truth will listen to His voice. Pilate clearly didn't, even as he unwittingly spoke it.

It seems that there is a great deal of confusion these days about what constitutes the truth and what does not. You would think in an age when we have access to more information than any generation of humans before us, we might be able to discern what is true and what is not quite easily. Such is not the case, however. In the blizzard of news and data that are freely circulated at the speed of light around our world, it is rare to find a straightforward, factual news story that just tells the truth. So often, reports are laced in opinion, people's feelings, and incomplete information. Stories that offer polar-opposite conclusions of the same events are frequently presented as factual, when simple logic dictates that they both cannot be true. We either went to the Moon or we didn't. The Earth is either flat or a globe. Elvis is either dead or he isn't You can see the need for clarification if both of these opposing sides of a story are presented as real. Science can perhaps provide insights, if we allow it to present its own truth. Powerful telescopes can actually zoom in on the Moon's surface and see the Apollo landing sights on a clear night. Satellites, and now commercial space programs can help us see the real curvature of the Earth if you travel high enough. And as far as Elvis is concerned...well, if you are concerned about that, you're on your own! ("Thank you very much!")

But even science, at its best, only ever proposes a theory about what is. It may be a very well-tested and time-honored theory that is quite repeatable and demonstrable, and thus is accepted as true. The laws of physics, after-all, hold true throughout our universe. Except when they don't—such as inside a black hole or in the early moments after the creation of the universe. There it seems, everything we know breaks

down and other "truths" take over.

So, the question comes to us: is "truth" relative to the observer, or is it something that is relative to culture or creed, to geography or epoch? Or is there some actual, universal "truth" out there that can be known as such and accepted in light of even the slickest of "fake news" stories that we might be peppered with?

The answer is yes. His name is Jesus Christ. Truth is not a "what?," but a Who!

Those who have the capacity to embrace the truth of who He is will respond to the claims that His truth makes on our hearts. For example, when we accept the truth that we love our spouse or children or family, we will go to extraordinary lengths—even heroic ones—to serve and protect them. We will make amazing sacrifices and endure great suffering for them if it were deemed necessary for them to survive and flourish in this world. The truth of that love is singular and uncompromising. It is chastening and bold. It demands a response from us and will not rest until we make it. We don't need a scientific theory to prove to us that we love them. We simply do.

The truth of God's love for us, Jesus Christ, either finds a home in our hearts, or not, all depending if we make room and welcome His truth. We have proven over the millennia of being quite capable of crowding the Lord out—we can work very hard and collect many-varied distractions, toys, and amusements that we leave precious little room in our lives for the things of God. Truth, in this case, may seem unimportant to us or even annoying in that it challenges us to re-order our lives and commitments. And who wants to do THAT?! Truth also reminds us that we will not be completely happy or encounter real rest until we are one with our Creator. This is an inconvenient truth if there ever was one, because it means we cannot ultimately control our lives or our world. Only God can do that. And THAT means we must re-orient our lives to seek after His truth, to pursue it at all cost and treasure it above anything else. Because only in God will we find our ultimate peace.

We remember the words of Jesus in the Communion Rite at every Mass: "Peace I leave you, my peace I give you." And don't we deep down want the real Peace that can only come from a right-relationship with God and each other? That is the kind of peace that Christ came to bring us, unlike the cheap substitute that the world sometimes tries to offer in its place. Our hearts know the truth, the true difference between the two.

So, what is truth? For us disciples, it is the loving presence of the Lord, alive in our hearts and present in our relationships with others. It is God working through us and for the salvation of the world. It is the enduring reality of the Risen Christ dwelling in our midst. May we open our very souls to His truth this day.


