From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

One of the scariest movies I have ever seen is the classic 1980 film, *The Shining*. Based on the book of the same title by Stephen King, you don't have to get very far into it to be creepedout by Jack Nicholas' character or the



strange connection between his son, Danny, and Scatman Crothers' character, Mr. Halloran. Directed by Stanley Kubrick, this psychological, paranormal masterpiece of horror is sure to make you check under your bed twice before turning out the lights.

And yet, what we really ought to fear, is laid out in broad daylight for us in this weekend's Gospel passage from St. Matthew. Often referred to as the Last Judgement, this divine sorting that comes at the end of time is final and shocking. Here's what makes it so terrifying: neither the good nor the bad see it coming. Both are genuinely surprised that they had significant, eternal-life-altering encounters with the Lord Jesus during their lifetimes. One might expect to remember an incident or two, if we ever bumped into a real celebrity. How much more so, Jesus, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Son of God, Co-Creator of the Universe, the Christ, the Anointed one, the Messiah....But no. In all cases, no one recognizes Him.

And here is where the utter terror strikes: we may not ever recall encountering the Lord, yet He remembers every single encounter with each of us! He remembers when we offered Him a drink when He was thirsty, food upon discovering His hunger, clothing and shelter when needed, basic human comfort, presence and compassion where it was lacking. He remembers it all! And He remembers when we failed to offer these necessary things in His suffering. Every single time, when we failed to show even the most fundamental level of human decency.

For the real horror is to realize that our Saving Lord was present in all those who were ever in need at any moment in our lives, anywhere in our world. Now, maybe we ate and drank with Jesus, partied with Him until dawn, joked and laughed, told stories, sang songs and danced with Him until we collapsed with joyful exhaustion. Everybody loves a good party. But true and lasting friendships don't end when

the music stops. Rather, they kick into high gear when someone we love is hurting or in need, or suffering or lacking, or being held captive. And if we truly value this loving friendship, in honor of that great love that has enraptured our hearts and fulfilled our deepest dreams, we will not stand by to see anyone else, another...a stranger... suffer these things as well. If that love and friendship means anything at all, we will not rest until these wrongs are righted, until compassion is shown, mercy offered—within our power to do so. That Jesus Christ was somehow mysteriously present in each of these suffering strangers is almost immaterial.

We know perfectly well that if we love our parents, we could not possibly stand aside and remain idle if we saw an older person without food or drink. We know we would do anything to bring them nourishment, at least for that moment. We know perfectly well that if we love our children, we could not possibly fail to act if we witnessed a child improperly clothed for the winter winds or was left alone and crying for help. Our inner parental instincts would move heaven and earth to help that little one. We do not need to know that this imprisoned stranger is also and actually the Lord Jesus in a different time and place. We only need to know that if we have the amazing capacity to love our own family and friends when they are hurting, we can love "the other," "another," "any other," as well. It's what we would do for those whom we love. It is what those who love us would do for us if we were ever in need. It is indeed what Jesus who loves us the most would do for us if we were in need. It is what Jesus would have us do for these least ones, when they would be in need. Do we really need to know...just one step more, that those in need are actually Jesus? Or ought we be satisfied in simply imitating our Savior who loved us all...you know, because that's what Jesus would do?!

Hollywood horror movies will come and go. The one reality that truly ought to keep us awake at night and cause us to constantly be on watch is this one story we've heard today. Because Jesus takes it all personally. Every little bit.

Through constant prayer, regular penance and a docile, humble heart, may we never miss an opportunity to serve the suffering Christ in our midst.

2020-2021 CORI

If you are a volunteer you must fill out a $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ riminal $\underline{\mathbf{O}}$ ffender Record Information Form every year.

The Archdiocese of Boston requires all clergy, all parish staff (full and part-time), and all volunteers (18 years of age and older) who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly, or the disabled will undergo an annual CORI check.

No matter what you volunteer to do, if your duties are carried out on parish property, or under the parish name, you must be CORI-ed every year.

Please see your Ministry Leader, a Deacon, or a Priest for a CORI form. It must be completed and your identity verified, then placed in the collection box, or mail it to the CORI Coordinators: Deacon Paul Dow and Maureen Dow to:






