From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

These words from Luke's Gospel this weekend have followed me from parish to parish, sung gently, humbly, and with great hope at countless funerals over the



years. Capturing a tender slice of the human heart, they seem to say, "Now that all is lost, You are my only hope left." How many times have we been forced to confront the awful reality of death and loss? We do everything within our human power to live and celebrate the gifts of life and love as they have been given to us, but every one of us ultimately comes to a moment when no matter what we do, no matter how hard we try, no matter how sincere our prayers and supplications are before God...we experience the end of all that is good in this world. Maybe that end comes peacefully and after a long and blissful life, or maybe it comes in an untimely and unforeseen mannerliterally on a day and at an hour we do not expect. Maybe it is preceded with much suffering and pain. But it comes nonetheless and its finality can be deafening and overwhelming.

Some years ago, I had the opportunity with a group of pilgrims from our Collaborative to climb down into what is believed to be Lazarus' tomb in Bethany, just outside of Jerusalem. Shimmying down a steep set of stairs carved into the soft rock and then crouching down to get into a small burial chamber with a rocky niche where a body once lay, you could "feel" the weight of the earth above you, the utter silence of death, the complete absence of sunlight and the stale air absent of oxygen and life. Left to himself, Lazarus and anyone else who will find themself in a tomb would stay there, lifeless and cold forever.

Until Jesus' words, that is, call them to life: "Lazarus, Come out!" "This day, you will be with me in Paradise!" When all hope has been expended, when all is lost, when there is nothing else that can be done, we can still turn to the Lord, who is the only One who can and will turn loss into gain, death in to life. "The good thief," as he has come to be known over the years, recognized that Jesus still could bring God's blessing to what was one of the cruelest and worst ways to die. Somehow, there might still be something for him in Jesus' Kingdom. Maybe he had heard about Jesus during his lifetime—not enough to change his ways, but enough to speak to the depths of his heart that Jesus was a good man, a holy man. Although conscious of his own sins and failings, he knew that Jesus didn't deserve this kind of death and condemnation. As a sinner, he knew what it was to be far from God and long for a return, somehow, to the righteousness that he had abandoned.

Maybe Jesus could still help him? Maybe there was still a shred of hope? Maybe?

I often wonder, too, what the conversation between Jesus and the other criminal was like after they both died. Was there a moment of reconciliation, of healing? Did this other criminal who "reviled" Jesus while hanging on the cross have a change of heart before he passed? Was he able to be with the Lord in Paradise as well? Does God's forgiveness through Christ extend to even the most hardened of individuals, who when confronted with the truth of who Jesus is, reflect back even the tiniest ray of God's light? Does God see and recognize that?

Sometimes we pray in the Eucharistic Prayers at Mass, "Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy...." Sometimes that is mercy longed-for that only God knows about. In the end, only God truly knows the human heart and only God can fulfill and satisfy every human hope and desire, no matter how far off-track we get in this life.

So, as we bring this month of remembering and praying for the dead to a conclusion, and as we celebrate this final weekend of our Church's liturgical year, we celebrate Jesus Christ as the King of the Universe. As the ancient hymn from the Letter to the Colossians calls us to ponder: "For in Him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile all things for Him, making peace by the blood of His cross through Him, whether those on earth or those in Heaven." (Col 1:20)

A prayer for every one of us to offer now and always: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." May we always long to hear His reply: "This day, you will be with me in Paradise!"

Meet the Ministry

Linens and Laundry



Each year we gather at family tables to share Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. Tables are adorned with festive table cloths and napkins; closets stocked with fresh guest towels.

Each day of the year in our Collaborative, we are invited to the Lord's table to partake in the Eucharistic meal. The altar is adorned with a pressed linen altar cloth and corporal towel upon which the chalice and paten are placed.

There is a fresh cloth on the credence (side) table for the mixing of water and wine. Two to three pristine and impeccably folded linen towels, or purificators, are for the washing of the hands and for the wiping of the chalices.

With twelve scheduled Masses per week across our Collaborative, along with funerals, other sacraments, and holy day liturgies, how are the needs of our table met? Meet the "Linen and Laundry" ministry.

Each week, volunteers pick-up the soiled laundry bag from each church sacristy. They wash and dry the laundry at home using their own machines. They iron each purificator and fold it in thirds so that each red cross is front and center. They stock each sacristy with fresh linens and towels to meet weekly and peak needs.

Linens and Laundry at all churches is a "bare bones" operation. St. Ann has a "Ministry of One," Nativity has two people, and Immaculate Conception has six volunteers.

They may be scarce in number, but they are rich in dedication and commitment. Some have served for 15, 20, or 30+ years. "I love my church and the people that go there. That's why I'm involved." But there are concerns about aging out and being unable to continue helping. Younger parishioners are encouraged to get involved, including professional young adults and youth for school service hours. What better project since you can do this at your leisure in your own home and time!

Their homage to the Lord and the Mass is reflected in their generosity of spirt. There is a genuine humility for what they call a "simple job that just needs to be done" and for their invisibility: "Most of the congregation has no idea. For them, everything is just magically refreshed!"

This ministry is seeking help. St. Ann would welcome additional backup. Immaculate Conception is urgently looking for volunteers for January and February to replace those who can no longer serve. If God is calling you to this ministry, please reach out to them and ask to "Meet the Ministry."

The Library (pictured) has a new look with tables that transform the space into a classroom while still preserving



the use of the room as a Library. The tables can easily stack in the corner to create an open space for movement, theatrical presentations,

or story hour. The Math Lab has interlocking tables that provide an expanded work surface that amply accommodates students' Chromebooks, workbooks, and whiteboards, all of which are tools used for every lesson. (pictured) On test days, the table pieces separate easily for privacy and distance. Chromebooks are available to all

students in grades 1–8, which expand the learning options and engage students. The addition of digital tools establish individualized learning pathways and offer options that promote student voice as well as address differences in students'
