From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I don't know about you these days, but I spend a fair amount of time watching and waiting. Every morning, I scan the newspaper for the daily virus cases and death count. I keep waiting for some positive trends, as we saw for a brief



period of time this summer, to return. I scan the financial reports, hoping for some positive signs that our economy is improving, realizing that so much of it is way beyond my ability to analyze. I watch over some Church-related news blogs, just, you know, to keep up on what's going on. I scan the weather reports wondering if it will be hot or cold, rainy or snowy...if for no other reason than to choose what jacket to wear on my way out the door. I scan my calendar, looking ahead to what Masses and events I will be involved with in the coming hours and days, and what I might need to do to prepare for them. I occasionally check my bank account, just to make sure I haven't missed any bills or to see if there is any money there. I scan the headlines of social and online news media looking for ... what? Some signs of hope? A good heart-warming story to brighten my day? A cute dog or cat video? (Full disclosure: they are far more amusing than I care to admit to!) Sometimes, I just pause, wherever I am, to just look around and see what I can see.

This weekend our Church once again begins yet another new liturgical year and cycle of readings, watching and waiting for the return of the Lord Jesus, as He promised. We don't know a great deal about exactly what that will look like, only that there will be no question about what is happening when it does. We do know, however, that the Lord will come at a time and hour when we do not expect it. So the only reasonable and prudent approach to living our lives is to be watchful and ready at all times. We may not get an advance email or tweet telling us that He's here, but hopefully we will be (mostly) prepared to welcome the Lord when He comes.

So what, exactly does that mean? I think it has to do with having things in order, ready to go. If you are cooking a meal, having all the ingredients laid out in their correct measurements and easily at hand will make the meal come out so much easier and quicker. If you have to go rummaging through the cabinets and fridge looking for every item when you need it, things will get cold or burn or dry out while you are searching for the next thing. An Advent question is: how are things laid out in my life? Is there order or chaos? Can I easily access the things that I need to serve the Lord, or am I constantly finding myself struggling to locate them when they are called for?

Many years ago, I attended a golf school up in Vermont with some friends. For several days, I took lessons from a golf pro on all of the finer aspects of the game—how to properly grip the club, how to select which iron to use, how to correct a slice and even how to get out of a sand trap (a very useful skill that I would come to rely on!). One of the lessons that really stuck with me, however, was the

concept of always playing what he called, "Ready Golf." In other words, to always be thinking ahead to what comes next, to be always ready to hit your ball when it is your turn so that nobody has to wait for you and to already have the next iron or putter you might need with you when you are on the fairway, so that you don't have to waste time going back and forth to your bag. To play "Ready Golf," required a mindset that was alert and aware of what was happening around you on the course. It forced you to think about the other players and what they might be doing, or even thinking, so that you could be ready and poised for your next move. Sometimes the mental energy of awareness was more taxing than the physical effort of hitting the ball and moving about the course. So many moving parts!

If we are living our Faith with this same kind of alertness, then it means we are actively watching and responding to many things that are moving around us. While we can all feel very caged-in these days with so many restrictions from the pandemic, that doesn't mean we can't be attentive to those who are in our social bubble or cohort, or that there may well be times when we are called to move about in relationship or connection to others. Charity begins at home, but it never stops there.

So, what to do this Advent? First, I would suggest that you think about <u>now</u> how you want to celebrate Christmas. Will you attend Mass through our live-streamed celebration online, or will you plan to attend one of our live, in-person celebrations in our churches? Although plans can always change, make a plan and work the rest of the holiday celebration around it. This way, you have made the Lord number one in your priorities for the holidays.

Secondly, consider how you might help others who are in need. The Christmas collection at Mass on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day (and the mailed-in envelopes associated with it) are reserved to help the sick and retired priests of the Archdiocese. Over the years, these funds have been used to care for priests like Fr. Broderick, Fr. Sherry, Fr. Piché, Fr. Mason, Fr. Leonard, Fr. Bérubé, and now Fr. George, Fr. Bill, and Fr. Charley. Your generosity at Christmas will greatly help to further this care to those who are presently in need. Think about our local charities, especially the local chapters of the St. Vincent de Paul Society whose members regularly help the needy in our own communities. Consider making a gift to the Pelican Fund that supports those in long-term, 12-step recovery programs. Look to supporting the many community-based programs that seek to alleviate hunger locally. Also

remember our brothers and sisters in Haiti through the IC Haiti educational program in Puit Cha Cha. These are but a few ways to reach out and offer care beyond ourselves through awareness of the needs of others.

Finally, order your day with prayer. Attend Daily Mass if you are able. Set aside some time for personal prayer. Read from the Bible each day, even if it is a short passage or part of a Psalm. Explore the lives of the saints. The Church's calendar is full of many feast days and celebrations. Learn more about why each of these holy men and women left a lasting mark on the Church and world by how they lived out their Faith. Join us for a moment of quite prayer in the church through the scheduled times for Adoration. Get involved with one of our online programs: Engage, Word on Fire, and Formed among others. Our bulletin (printed or online) is full of ideas and opportunities.

When we are actively thinking about the things of God, when we are consciously involved in ordering our lives around the presence of God, when we are fully engaged in being about the work that God would have us do...we will be more ready and alert to meet the Lord when He does come, whether that be through a chance encounter with a stranger in the supermarket parking lot or at the end of time with His Second Coming. We don't want to miss it or find ourselves caught unaware....

This Advent, let us keep scanning and searching, until the hope that we long for is truly and finally fulfilled.
