



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

So many of us are significantly removed from our food sources, that most of the Scriptural references and images that would have been obvious and clear in their meaning to our ancestors have





Take bread, for instance. In order to have bread, you need first to obtain its primary ingredient: flour. In order to have flour, you must have grain to grind-up. In order to access the grain, you must first separate the kernels of grain from the chaff or husk that

surrounds it on the stalk of wheat. This all-important process of separation was called winnowing, as it involved first taking the whole stalks of wheat and violently smashing them onto a clear area on the ground. This smashing would then loosen the kernels of grain from the outer husks of chaff. In order to then actually separate one from another, a large woven flattened basket of a fan would then be used to toss the whole mixture up in the air, then with the downward stroke of the fan, the breeze would blow the light, fluffy chaff some distance away from the heavier grains, which would collect in a pile closer to the ground. This was done over and over again until the grains were pure. The chaff would later be useful for burning as a fuel source for the ovens in which the bread was baked.

Flour made up of a mixture of grains and chaff was indigestible and useless. Only when separated, could the real blessing of nutritious, fresh-baked bread become a reality for us.

It is in this same way that sin and evil must be separated from goodness and grace so that the blessings of God's Kingdom may be be made manifest for us all. John the Baptist came preaching a primary message of repentance as a way to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord. This is just as true today as it was for the people who were to meet the earthly Jesus when He came among them. Sin and evil blind us to God's pathways and make us deaf to God's

Word. That is why we must turn away from our sins and follow a way of repentance in order to be part of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Fortunately, there are many ways to do this! One is to be about works of mercy and charity. When we are actively doing good and seeking that which is righteous and just, sin has no maneuvering room in our lives. We can mostly "crowd out" sin by focusing our conscious efforts on doing the good and positive things that God invites us to each day, beginning with care of our neighbor. The sacrifices we make for others strengthen our inner commitment to the Lord.

Another way to turn from sin is to involve ourselves in regular and constant prayer. As St. Paul tells us in today's Second Reading: "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:6-7) St. Paul was so confident in the power of prayer that he could encourage his communities to "Rejoice always!", even in the midst of suffering and persecution.

It is in this spirit this weekend that we don festive rosecolored vestments and take comfort in the prophet's words

to rejoice heartily and sing with a full voice as at a festival! God has answered our prayers and will fulfill all His promises of deliverance and salvation. Even though the days are getting shorter and darkness seems to have the upper hand, as an Advent people, we await the dawning



of light that surely will come when the Son of Justice and Righteousness appears. On that "Day of the Lord," all hope will be fulfilled and everything will at last be made manifest. We will see the vindication of our God and the perfection of all that is good and right and holy!

Oh, and on that day, the bread will be amazing!

An Invitation to Holy Redeemer from IC Haiti

Since 2009, IC Haiti has been a 501 c 3 incorporated, taxexempt, non-profit organization. Through it, parishioners of the Immaculate Conception parish and other kind donors built and have continued to support the Fr. Marc Piché elementary school in the town of Puit Chacha, Haiti.

Now IC Haiti would like to invite you, the parishioners of Holy Redeemer parish, to join in this worthy ministry in Haiti. IC Haiti is the sole financial support for the school in Puit Chacha which provides education to approximately 200 children from kindergarten to 6th grade. As you are well aware Haiti is the poorest country in the Americas; and since 2009, whenever Haiti has suffered a devastating natural disaster such as an earthquake or hurricane, IC Haiti has responded with emergency medical relief funding through Health Equity International, formerly known as St. Boniface Haiti Foundation, and its hospital complex a few miles north of Puit Chacha.

This year alone our expenses to run the school along with its hot lunch and dental care programs and to provide medical care to hurricane victims amounted to \$83,000. Our yearlong administrative costs amounted to less than 2 tenths of one percent of our total expenditures. We do our best to be good stewards of the donations people make to support IC Haiti's ministry to the people we have been called to serve.

The final quarterly collection of 2021 for IC Haiti will be taken up the weekend of December 18–19. On the Sunday prior to the collection, a member of the Board of Directors for IC Haiti will make a direct appeal for your generosity and provide a brief update on our ministry to the people and school community of Puit Chacha, Haiti.

Immaculate Conception School



Immaculate Conception School held the 20th anniversary North Pole Express on Saturday, December 4. After a year off due to the pandemic, it was truly exciting to be able to offer this beloved Christmastime experience to area residents. The school embarked on

making the magic happen this year after surveying parents who would be responsible for volunteering at the fundraiser. We were surprised to find a resounding willingness from our school parents to ride the train, volunteer in the Polar Village, and work together in groups to organize this important event. We then surveyed the Middle School students' families to understand their comfort level in having their children volunteer as elves on the train. Based on responses from both parent volunteers and student volunteers, jobs were adjusted to allow volunteer opportunities that met a variety of comfort levels. The NPE organizers did a fabulous job adjusting parts of the experience to be covid-friendly and also conform to on-train restrictions set by the MBTA. Adjustments were made to the design of the Polar Village to minimize large groups from gathering in confined areas. The number of riders on each train was also reduced to allow space between families but also to minimize the large crowd that would gather in the Polar Village while waiting to board the train. We added a beautiful stage for Mrs. Claus and Santa's elves to wave at a safe distance yet still allow for picture taking opportunities. We also adjusted how customers shopped at The Mercantile and The Bakery, which then enabled us to use the large tent as a warming station for the volunteers. Train times were adjusted to allow a crew to sanitize each train car after each ride. Although MBTA guidelines did not allow for food and drink to be consumed on the ride, each rider left the train with a little goodie bag of cocoa mix and cookies to enjoy at home. The weather was perfect—a little crispness in the air and shining sun. Our North Pole riders came off the train smiling, but the smiles were especially plentiful among the IC volunteers who came together, once again, to create a magical experience for everyone.

Platform Managers escorted passengers to the train cars to ensure each family was seated together.


