2020 Christmas Mass Schedule Holy Redeemer – Immaculate Conception Collaborative

Dear Parishioners,

As we come towards the final days of 2020, we can all say that this year has been unlike any other in recent memory. Despite the many losses and sacrifices made, we still have much to be grateful for, most especially the gift of our Faith and the promise of new life through Jesus Christ. As we look forward to celebrating His birth in just a few days, it is important to realize that our Christmas celebrations will be very different this year as well. Unless we encounter any restrictions or further directives from the Archdiocese or the State, we are intending to offer the following schedule of live, in-person Masses for Christmas. Please be aware of the following:

 Advanced registration is required through our <u>EventBrite</u> system on our <u>website</u> or by calling our office during business hours (9:00am–2:30pm M–F). The purpose of advanced-registration is to ensure that too many people do not attend any one Mass and to provide an easy way to facilitate contact-tracing, should an exposure to COVID-19 be detected at a later time.

Tickets will be available on a first-come, first-served basis once registration opens on Wednesday morning December 16 at 7:00am.

 Every person, including children, must have their own ticket. Infants, if held by a parent, are exempt.

Once reserved, tickets must be **printed at home** from the <u>EventBrite</u> site or can be available through our office by mail or picked up in person no later than 2:30pm on Tuesday, December 22.

 Tickets will need to be presented for entrance into any Christmas Mass.

Due to the limits placed on seating by social-distancing requirements, there will be no unregistered walk-ins allowed at any Mass. Please register ahead of time using the EventBrite system. If the Mass you wish to attend is full or "sold out," please register for a different Mass or plan to enjoy Mass at home via our live-stream.

- Doors will open 30 minutes prior to each Mass. If any line forms at the entrance door, people must stay 6 feet apart from one another while waiting to enter the church.
- There are no reserved seats. All seats are available on a first-come, first-served basis. At Nativity Church, once the church itself has filled to its limited capacity, any additional seating must be through overflow seating in the church hall, if available. Please note that IC Church will not have any overflow seating in the school gym this year because that space has been re-purposed into a classroom for school use.
- Face masks are required for the duration of the Mass for all persons, except for children under 5.
- Social-distancing is required from anyone not living in your immediate household.

To facilitate necessary safe ventilation, church windows may be kept open during the Mass, so **please dress** appropriately for the weather.

A few additional considerations:

- Anyone who is feeling sick, has been recently exposed to COVID-19 or is required to quarantine from exposure or recent travel, MUST stay home and may not attend Christmas Mass in person. In these cases, please enjoy one of our Live-Streamed Masses via <u>Facebook</u> or on our <u>website</u>.
- If you are in a vulnerable health category or live with someone who is, we strongly recommend staying home and enjoying one of our Live-Streamed Christmas Masses via <u>Facebook</u> or on our <u>website</u>.
- Please realize that this year, due to the extremely limited seating capacity necessary due to social-distancing requirements, we will only be able to accommodate about 25% of those who have traditionally attended our Christmas Masses in years past. Unless you have made an advanced registration, please stay home and enjoy one of our Live-Streamed Masses via Facebook or on our website.

As we work to celebrate the Coming of Christ into world, let us keep one another in prayer for safety, protection, and a swift end to the pandemic. May the Joy of Christ be in our hearts and alive in our care for and service to others.

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Growing up, one of the cherished places in our home wasn't actually inside our house, but was found out in the backyard, beyond the grass and away from the trees. It was our family garden. Each year my father would dig and till the



soil in the late spring when the ground became soft and the sun began to warm things up a bit from the winter chill. Rows were laid out and string carefully stretched to mark where each type of vegetable and fruit would be planted. Seeds that had been carefully organized and prepared in our basement over the winter were meticulously placed in each earthen furrow, covered over with dirt and attentively watered to set their growth in motion.

We planted corn and tomatoes, peas, carrots, cucumbers, summer and zucchini squash, wax and green beans, watermelon, rhubarb, and leafy green lettuce. On a good year, sunflowers and pumpkins were planted to finish off the harvest season. As a kid, the garden was a magical place, full of mystery as to how all of these plants could produce good, tasty food for us to eat. I learned to treasure the rich, full flavor of sun-ripened tomatoes, eat the peas right out of their pods and crunch fresh rhubarb stalks into small dixie cups of sugar. We all took turns watering the garden, plucking up the weeds (the weeds, and only the weeds, now!), fertilizing as needed and sometimes putting up chicken wire to keep the wild rabbits out, although they were awfully cute! It was sacred ground, if ever there was any, reverenced and prized as a place that brought-forth and celebrated life.

It is this potent image of a garden, teaming with an abundance of life, that Isaiah uses to describe God's plan for renewing the earth. Justice and praise are the crops that will bring delight to God's harvest. Our own joy at working in this garden is a fruit in and of itself. The rich, late-summer feast of righteousness will bring the completeness we all long for.

This notion of God's Kingdom as a garden invokes several qualities of the "Gardener" that are worth taking note of during our Advent journey. To begin with, gardening requires a lot of patience. What is planted today takes weeks to sprout and months to grow into maturity. Nothing happens overnight. So it is with the things of God - they take time to spread their roots and inch their way up out of the soil. When we long for the harvest, we must often patiently await its fulfillment on a timeline that is not our own. Advent is a season to ponder time itself and our meager place in it. The things of God grow on the scale of millennia and eons, not hours and days. And yet, we participate in their growth every day by our own contributions of watering, fertilizing and weeding; of prayer and fasting, our imperfect efforts to love, show mercy, and offer forgiveness.

Sometimes the produce of a garden yields something different than expected! We planted what we thought were beans only to discover that eggplant had grown! It is amazing how much little, tiny seeds can look alike or get

inadvertently mixed with others. There can be joy at discovering new growth. God ultimately determines what grows and what does not. And our God is a God of surprises!

There is also to be found a deep and lasting satisfaction when a successful harvest is realized. All the sweat, hard work, aching muscles, bug bites, sunburn, and constant, vigilant attention pay off in an abundance of lushness that satisfies our deepest cravings. Advent reminds us that while we may struggle here in this time and place to bring about something that is never fully realized in our present moment, we are invited to the fullness of the harvest when God draws all things to their rightful conclusion. Our faith, our daily faithfulness, our everyday sacrifices all lead us towards a great banquet feast the likes of which we can barely conceive. The Gospel reminds us, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied!" It will all be worth it!

So, this Advent season, when the earth seems frigid and bare and our COVID-stricken world longs for healing, may we be the bearers of Isaiah's vision of fruitful patience and stalwart fidelity. For our God truly comes to announce a year of vindication, a time of true and lasting joy for us all. Watch for it, for it will surely come...and it will be glorious!




