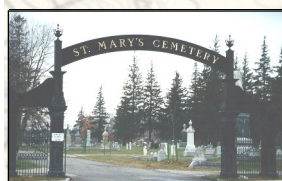

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

A friend of mine once said, "Families would be wonderful if they didn't have any people in them!" Another friend quoted an old truism, "You can choose your friends, but not your family." At some point in our lives, we will struggle with those to whom we are related. Hopefully, most of these struggles will be minor and short-lived, but as we go further into our life journey, we know that challenges can come up. It is only by the grace of God that we navigate these minefields and come out intact on the other side. St. Paul's community in Colossae must have had its share of struggles, as they were gently and lovingly admonished to forbearance, forgiveness, patience, and kindness.

This weekend we look to the Holy Family as a model of living family life in a grace-filled and joyous manner. But we ought not think that they didn't have their share of misunderstandings and difficulties. This weekend's Gospel story is a good example of that. What parent wouldn't be deeply troubled and upset with their (slightly precocious?) 12-year-old who went off on his own, even with the very best of intentions and motives? What 12-year-old wouldn't be testing their parents' limits and struggling to become more and more independent as they grow? There was no sin here, but the frustration level must have been through the roof! A number of tense hours passed, a frantic search ensued, emotions churned, angst percolated...it was a perfect recipe for an explosion that could have led to hurt and resentment. Yet because of the love that bound them together, they withheld judgement and waited to hear the truth from one another. That truth, even if not fully understood at the time, would lead to peace—a renewal of the right-relationship with each other that is a reflection of their own relationship as a family and individually with God.

Let's not be too quick to put Jesus, Mary and Joseph as the Holy Family on too high a pedestal, that what they achieved in their family life is unreachable for us mere sinners. They worked hard at living out their holiness with many of the same struggles that we face in our daily lives. This ought to give us hope and encouragement as we seek to live in that same peace among our own kin.

At the end of the day, I think it all boils down to trust: that God will be faithful, that love is strong enough to overcome the daily challenges of living, that family life has a sacred purpose and meaning that will unfold over the course of our lives, that all of this will be for the greater glory of God.

In Nazareth, in a small church dedicated to St. Joseph, the patron saint of families, there is a beautiful fresco above the main apse of the Holy Family depicting Jesus when he was about 12 years old. Above the three of them is the faint image of the Holy Spirit, watching over them, guiding and blessing them with the divine presence as they go about their daily lives. While there is no doubt that the Spirit was alive and present in their midst, we must never think that this same Holy Spirit isn't also powerfully working in the lives of our families as well. With God's help, we, too, will be led, guided and sanctified.

Thank you St. Vincent de Paul! To have such a support system around me filled me with the faith I needed and has given me hope. I thank God for you.

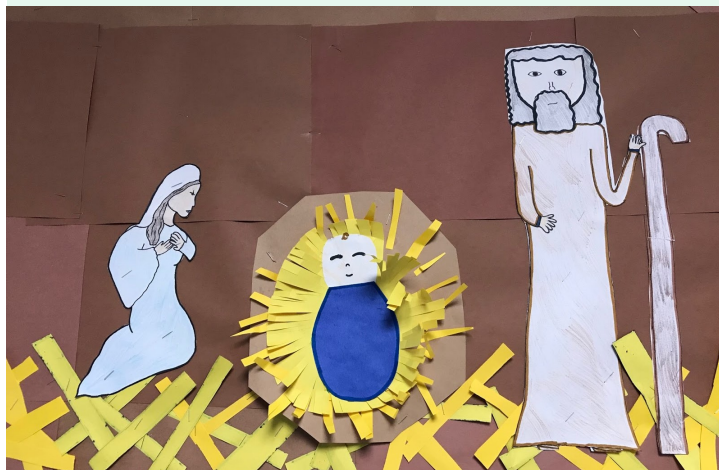

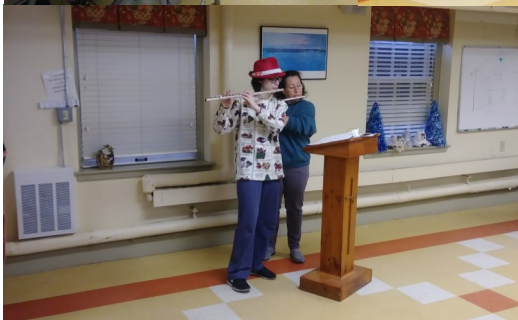
