### From the Pastor

#### Dear Parishioners,

The summer I turned 21, I decided it would be fun to learn how to make beer. I spent some time with a friend who did this more or less regularly and the process seemed fairly simple. Bring a big kettle of clean, pure water to a boil, add



your grain, malt, and hops, then allow to cool. Add yeast when the whole thing reaches room temperature or so, transfer to a large bottle with a one-way air valve and wait while the fermentation happens. After several days, filter and transfer the beer into sterilized bottles to await the final fermentation in the bottle, hence giving the beer its slight carbonation as a by-product. Keep it simple, my friend told me. And make sure the bottles are absolutely sterile or the beer will get spoiled.

So I dutifully followed all the steps, measuring this and meticulously following that. The only thing I cheated on a little bit was the beer bottles themselves. Instead of spending hours boiling them on the stove in a scalding water bath, as directed, I sent them on a trip through the dishwasher, with the "high temperature" setting switched to "on." I figured that ought to do it. Anytime that I had used that setting in the past, the dishes came out so hot, I always burned myself trying to handle them. "That's got to be hot enough to kill any bugs..." or so I thought.

As you can imagine, after several days resting in the basement, my homemade beer began to explode, one bottle at a time. Bang! In the middle of the night. Waking me and my family from a sound sleep. I lost about half of my home-brew through these detonations. The rest that survived was mostly undrinkable due to whatever contaminants had remained in the bottles despite my earnest dishwasher efforts to burn them away. Our basement reeked of rotten beer for months after my ill-fated endeavor. Lesson learned. Sterile means sterile, not sort-of-sterile. Got it! At least I never tried to start a craft brewery or work on an infectious disease wing of a hospital. I'll keep my day job.

Speaking of which, although John the Baptist was known not to have taken any strong drink—beer or otherwise—he recognized that in order to properly prepare for The Lord's coming, no contaminants could litter our hearts. So, his mission as the long-promised Herald of the Christ's coming was to invite everyone to turn away from their sins and accept a baptism of repentance. It mattered not what sins

anyone had—no matter how small or how great—only that they were willing to let them go and with God's help embrace a path of repentance.

Repentance did not mean forgetting about one's sins or ignoring what they had done, only that they were completely sincere in wanting to leave them behind and live their lives justly and honestly before our God. This was the one requirement for getting ready to welcome the Lord Jesus when He came: a repentant heart. Those who were proud, convinced of their own righteousness or blindly unaware of their need for repentance would risk missing the Lord and being part of this Kingdom. Just like germs in a beer bottle, a soured, spoiled mess awaits anyone who tries to hold on to sin and follow God.

So, this Advent, we once again hear the cry of the Baptist calling us to repentance, inviting us to new life. What will our response be? A meticulous and honest change of heart, or will we be tempted to cut a few corners and settle for something less-than-sterile, less than holy? Advent is a good time to do an honest assessment of how we are living our lives and whether we are truly ready to welcome The Lord when He comes, either at Christmas or at the end of time...you know, whichever comes first.





*Other Items*: blanket, small stuffed animal, small activity such as a coloring book, puzzle, Legos, etc., age-appropriate book


