

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Last week I received my first COVID vaccination shot. After almost a year of living through this pandemic, with all of the sacrifices and heartache it has caused, I have to tell you that this long-anticipated moment was a bit of a let-



down, it was anticlimactic...a disappointment, if you will. It's not that anything went wrong or that it was not done properly or anything like that...everyone at the vaccination site was perfectly professional and appropriate. It's just that, well, it was just a shot, over in about 5 seconds with no drama whatsoever. The needle was tiny and I barely felt it. My shoulder was slightly sore in the vaccination spot for maybe a day, if that. Nothing debilitating at all. I think I might have felt like I was coming down with a cold for a few hours later that day, maybe, but not really. And it all went away by the next morning when I awoke chipper, full of energy, and ready to meet the day.

I've had plenty of shots over the years. I get the flu shot every year and various and sorted updates for this and that. Again, little drama there. The worst shots I received in recent memory were about 10 years ago when I was getting ready to travel to Haiti. Nurse Diesel stuck me with everything she had that day! I was sore for weeks that followed in a variety of body parts. I think I could have drunk freely from a cesspool afterwards with no ill effects, so many plagues and diseases had I been inoculated from that day! May God bless the people of Haiti!

But with all the hype and anticipation, this one was a nonevent. And at the same time, I am so grateful to have (Continued on page 4)

Ashes will be distributed at all liturgies.

There will be a few differences this year, however, due to COVID considerations: Most of the liturgies will be Services of the Word instead of Mass due to time and exposure considerations. It is safer for all involved to have shorter services. Also, ashes will be distributed via Q-tips to avoid direct contact between parishioners. A fresh Q-tip will be used for each person. The penitential call: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" will be spoken once, for the whole assembly, rather than individually for each person as they receive the mark of ashes. The 9:00 a.m. Mass will be live-streamed for those who cannot be with us in person, and the video will be available afterwards on our website and Facebook page.



received it and can't wait to complete the regimen with my second shot in a week or so. COVID vaccinations are not and will not be a golden pass to throw away face masks and forgo social distancing. It's not magic. We still need to keep doing these things for the time being, but getting vaccinated, I believe, is the path forward to eventually reaching a healthier degree of public safety...and freedom. When the majority of people have been vaccinated or have achieved immunity from this disease, the virus will have nowhere to go, and will eventually fade from public view and concern. And that will be the light at the end of the tunnel that is not an oncoming train, but constitutes real hope and realized dreams.

To this end, I would encourage all of you who are able, to speak with your healthcare provider and consider getting vaccinated as soon as you can. That we even have this kind of medicine today is truly a wonder of modern science. I know that we've all heard stories about some people having various side effects from the vaccines. But I just wanted you to know that this was not my experience, nor the experience of most of the people I've talked with who have gotten their shots. Your mileage may vary, but even a few days of a flu-like reaction to the shots is far better than catching COVID itself, with all of the possible long-term health effects, provided, of course, that you survive. And at this point, I think we all have known someone who hasn't. I think that there is no better way to honor their memory than to fight back against this disease by our continued vigilance and embracing the opportunity to be vaccinated when it is our turn.

As of this writing, the State has announced a new call center designed to help residents age 75 and older who may be having difficulty navigating the online registration at www.mass.gov/covid-19-vaccine Just call 2-1-1 on your phone M–F from 8:00 a.m.–5:00 p.m. and a live person will assist our seniors in making an appointment to get vaccinated. Everyone is encouraged to use the website if at all possible, but it is good to know that there is help for those who need it. Also, if anyone is in need of a ride to get to a vaccination site once they have an appointment, please contact our office. We may be able to help with transportation.

Ultimately, Jesus is the source of healing for every disease and illness, every plague and pandemic. He is the complete cure for sin and death. In His name, may we seek health and protection always.

Centering Prayer for Lent

Our Lenten reflection on Jesus' words and works reveals Jesus' intimate relationship with his Father. We see the depth of Jesus' faith, trust and love for God. This relationship developed through prayer. Often we see Jesus withdraw from the crowds and even his apostles to pray alone in silence. Jesus tells us "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). Through Centering Prayer you enter your private room.

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from the fully human Jesus how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence.

Through prayer, Jesus, strengthened and moved by his Father's love for him, could willingly surrender his human life for love and reveal our God to us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus of Nazareth was transformed to become Jesus the Christ. We, too, can be transformed through prayer that unites us to God. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God as one who loves us unconditionally just as we are and trust God has plans to give us a future of hope.

Centering Prayer helps us say to the Father, "Not my will but yours be done" (Lk. 22: 42). Please consider joining us for weekly group Centering Prayer and let God move you closer to him. We gather Wednesday evenings from 6:00 p.m.–7:00 p.m. via ZOOM for 30 minutes of Centering Prayer and 30 minutes of Lectio Divina. All are welcome. At-Home Lenten Retreat

Jesus the Christ, our wounded healer, calls to us in this time of suffering. Following Jesus though our Lenten retreat we will stay awake with Jesus as he is wounded and suffers for us. We will give thanks for his great love and salvific suffering as we explore our own suffering and its transforming power. Responding to his love, we may allow Jesus to enter through our own wounds, heal us with his saving love, and be transformed.

Retreat packet materials will support learning through Scripture and offer teachings of Richard Rhor, Cynthia Bourgeault, Marcus Borg, Joan Chittister, Paul Coutinho SJ, Carlo Charrette, St. Ignatius of Loyola, Julien of Norwich, Henri Nouwen, Pope John Paul II, and others as well as poems, prayers, and questions for reflection.

Connecting with the Christ's many forms of suffering through prayer, reading, reflection, group sharing, and individual spiritual direction you will be aided to name and explore your own experiences of suffering and desire for healing. You will have opportunities for three individual one-hour sessions of spiritual direction by phone or zoom.

This retreat is designed to be affordable, convenient, and safe. It will begin with a group Zoom meeting to discuss the retreat's theme and prepare you for our Lenten journey. The fourth week Zoom meeting will include teaching and time to share reflections and responses to material read and support each other as the retreat continues. The closing session will provide an opportunity for you to share the fruits of retreat, continued desires, and questions.

Celebrating Black History Month

St. Josephine Bakhita, whose feast day we celebrated on February 8, was born in Sudan, kidnapped at age 7 and sold into slavery. Spending some time in Italy, she felt drawn to the Catholic Church and was baptized. As slavery is not legal in Italy, Josephine remained in Italy as a free citizen and joined the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893.

St. Benedict the Moor was the son of African slave parents. In Sicily, he was invited to join a group of Franciscan hermits after he was insulted because of his color. He eventually became their leader. He is most known for his ability to read people's minds.
