A Note from Fr. George



Retirement! Ah, yes! Now I can do what I want, when I want, whenever I want, etc...! The easy life at last! Although I've been in retirement mode for just about a month, I'm still trying to figure it all out. I've never done this before! However, you need to know that when a priest retires he leaves active ministry but he does not leave ministry. Being a priest is not a job, it's a vocation! Priesthood is not something you

retire from. Retirement is from active ministry...which means you are no longer assigned by the Diocesan Bishop to a specific parish or other ministry in the Diocese. The retired priest is free to live where he wants, for example, a family home, a house he may own or even Regina Cleri, our retirement home for priests in Boston, etc. And he is free to be involved in ministry to the degree he wishes or is able. After all, when you get older, you don't have the energy or stamina you had when you were 45. And so the retired priest may make himself available to various parishes to help with weekend Masses, perhaps funerals, filling in when a pastor goes on retreat, vacation, or a day off. With the declining number of priests in our Archdiocese, the assistance of retired priests is needed and most welcome.

Last year when retirement was approaching, Father Tim and I had a conversation to talk about my plans. Although I own a house in Maine with two good friends, Bishop John McCormack and Father John MacInnis. I knew I did not want to live there full time. I expressed my desire to continue living here in Newburyport and I am grateful that he extended the invitation for me to stay and to make my home here at Immaculate Conception Rectory. Immaculate Conception Parish has a long history of retired priests living in the Rectory. Some of the priests I have known who have retired here are Fathers John Jusseaume, Roger Carlin, Paul Berube, James Broderick, and presently, William McLaughlin. Each in his own way has blessed this Parish and its parishioners with wisdom and priestly service and ministry. I hope to be part of that legacy and grateful to Father Tim for the invitation to stay.

In addition to welcoming retired priests, Immaculate Conception provides hospitality to our neighboring priests for Saturday night supper. I remember when I was at Sacred Heart Parish in Amesbury from 1987 to 1995, I would frequently come over for supper on Saturday. Then in 2011, when I was assigned to Holy Redeemer Parish, Merrimac and West Newbury, I was amazed and very pleased to know that the welcome mat was still out at IC. You know, when you are the only priest in a Parish, you long for that fellowship with your brother priests, to catch up on news and to share thoughts and ideas. How I looked forward then and how I look forward now to those Saturday evening meals. This long tradition which started more than thirty-plus years ago continues today. such a wonderful meal for all of us to enjoy.

Part of figuring out what retirement is all about, is a commitment to help Father Tim to the degree I am able. With no priest available to replace me, he will be the only priest assigned to our Collaborative. He needs our support, help, and understanding. And for me, perhaps, there will be time for more travel, for retreats to interesting places, for reading, for attending Friday afternoon matinees with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, for visiting art museums, for prayer and reflection, for spending the entire week at CAMPS—a youth ministry I helped start thirty-six years ago, for continuing to spend one weekend a year on a Cursillo, for walking more, and enjoying the beauty of our communities of Merrimac, West Newbury, Newbury, and Newburyport. Yes, it is good for us to be here.

Very soon, I will be celebrating my 50th anniversary as a Priest. I have been blessed to serve in the following Parishes: Saint Peter, East Gloucester (1970-1975), Saint Francis of Assisi, South Braintree (1975-1983), Immaculate Conception, Everett (1983–1987), Sacred Heart, Amesbury (1987–1995), Saint Margaret, Saugus (1996-2011), Blessed Sacrament Parish, Saugus (2008-2011), Holy Redeemer Parish (Nativity, Merrimac and Saint Ann, West Newbury) (2011–2015), Immaculate Conception Parish, Newbury and Newburyport and Holy Redeemer Parish, Merrimac and West Newbury (2015-2019). In addition to parish ministry, I have had the joy of serving on a Cursillo weekend just about every year since I lived Cursillo in 1973. And in 1984, together with Maureen Mulcahy, CAMPS was initiated. CAMPS, an acronym meaning Christ As My Personal Savior, is a high school youth ministry, inviting youth to experience a saving, loving relationship with Jesus Christ. Over these 36 years thousands of young people have participated. As one young camper expressed after his week at CAMPS, "This was the best week of my life." The true wealth and inspiration of each of these parishes, of the Cursillo movement, and of the CAMPS ministry, are the people who give of their time and talents to form these vibrant communities of faith, hope, and love. I have learned so much and been spiritually enriched by the people of God.

The Pastoral Plan of Holy Redeemer / Immaculate Conception Collaborative has as one of its goals the fostering of vocations particularly to the priesthood. Each of us is called to holiness, to live our Christian vocation, our call to follow Christ. I heard that call long ago. I was very young, and I responded and it has been a blessing ever since. Priesthood has blessed me more than I ever could have imagined or could have asked for. Pray for vocations especially to the priesthood and don't be afraid to encourage a young person to consider service to our Church in the priesthood.

Hopefully, I'll give you some updates on how I'm doing with this retirement experience but right now I'm getting ready to join Bishop Hennessey and 58 other priests on a weeklong retreat in Lutz, Florida. Following that I'll be visiting a friend of mine, Father John Mulloy, who is retired and spends the months of January and February in Florida. Not bad....See you Ash Wednesday!

Putting on the mind of Christ requires spending time with Christ, getting to know him, learning from him, and letting him lead and change you. During retreat time, through prayer, reading, reflection, group sharing, and individual spiritual direction you will explore following Christ's path of self-giving love as a way to share the mind of Christ.

This nearby, five-week retreat is designed to be both affordable and convenient for you. It will begin with a group meeting Thursday, February 20 to discuss the retreat's theme and prepare participants for a Lenten journey with Christ.

The group will meet again during the third week to share reflections and responses to material read and support each other as the retreat continues.

As we approach Holy Week, the closing meeting, during the fifth week, will provide an opportunity for you and others to share the fruits of retreat, continued desires, and your response to Christ's invitation to follow his path of self-giving love.

During the five weeks of retreat you will have opportunities for four individual one-hour sessions of spiritual direction scheduled at your convenience.

Exploring Jesus' path of self-giving love during Lent may encourage you to follow Christ to his death on the cross, his salvific act of self-giving love, enter into the Paschal Mystery, and celebrate your own rebirth in Christ on Easter.
