Dear Parishioners,

This past week, I was able to enjoy a week of prayer and reflection with more than 50 of my brother priests from the Boston area and beyond down at the Bethany Retreat Center, run by the



Diocese of St. Petersburg, Florida. Sponsored by Bishop Robert Hennessey from our local Merrimack region, the retreat this year featured Sr. Briege McKenna, O.S.C., sometimes known worldwide as "The Healing Nun." An author of multiple books on the power of the Sacraments and God's Healing Presence in our lives, she was a feisty and charming speaker, delivering story after story with her characteristic brogue and enduring wit. That she may have had an encounter with the Blarney Stone along the way was a given!

Among the many topics that she touched on over the course of the week, one of her talks included an exploration of the importance of the connection and unity between one's inner-self and the outer expression of our faith and devotion to God. In other words, the inside ought to match to the outside. It is no good to have an inner love of God if that never gets expressed in how we live our lives, and it is similarly useless to run around with external pious devotions if we never open our hearts to the transforming power of God's love. In all that we do, this connectedness is always implied, but can easily get off-track by the distractions of the world and the habits of sin that get embedded in our lives. True holiness lies in a unity between our inner relationship with God that flows joyfully into our worship and acts of charity.

This coming week we enter into, once again, our holy season of Lent in the Church's year with our celebration of Ash Wednesday. As a reminder that our sins lead only to death, we confront our own mortality and our constant need for repentance and God's forgiveness. As we seek renewal and look to jump-start our own call to holiness of life, paying close attention to Sr. Briege's insight on our need for inner and outer harmony is a great place to start our Lenten journey. It is a sound basis for evaluating what we must do to prepare ourselves for renewing our Baptismal Promises at Easter.

In the days ahead, as we "bury the Alleluia" and embrace our Lenten acts of penance, may we experience the wholeness of minds and hearts renewed in the cleansing power of God's grace.

Lenten Guidelines

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fast and abstinence. **Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
