

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's Gospel passage presents Jesus' healing ministry as a powerful sign of the already-present Kingdom of God. Where there was illness or suffering, Jesus' healing touch brought relief and deliverance. He was quite meticulous in His methodology and approach, not permitting the evil spirits to speak and possibly distract people from what was happening. It was Jesus' initiative, and nothing would be allowed to get in the way.



Because illness and physical suffering were often seen as signs that a person (or their family) had sinned or displeased God in some way, healing was a sure indication of God's blessing and favor. So, concurrent with Jesus' message of repentance and turning away from sin, was this potent experience of His healing ministry.

Laced in the midst of this story is a curious detail that we might be tempted today to dismiss as sexist and unimportant. When Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law, the very first thing she does is get up and wait on them! How awful, we might say from today's perspective! The poor woman was sick in bed and now that she's feeling a little better, the men in the room (including Jesus) let her wait on them?! Can't they get a cup of water on their own? How insensitive, we might think!

However, to the first century hearer of this Gospel, something else comes into focus: the healing was complete and total. It's not that Simon's mother-in-law was still weak and woozy from having been sick, but that she was completely restored. So much so, that she resumed her proper and expected role in the household. She was restored to her former, honorable, position. There would have been joy in her heart to get back to work, to be a productive member of the family once again. In fact, the whole family was healed by this restoration of her to her proper place and role. She might have been the only one who knew how to make bread or cook in the family! Everyone had been suffering alongside her, while she was sidelined and unable to do the things that everyone relied on for healthy family life. There was a wholeness to Jesus' healing ministry that touched not only the sick or afflicted, but the entire family and community.

This is a lens for us to see the fuller picture of Jesus' healing ministry: it is for everyone! It reaches far beyond

His ministry was to go far beyond Galilee and be offered for all humanity in all times and places. The scope of what God has accomplished through Jesus' earthly ministry culminating in His Passion, Death, and Resurrection is beyond measure. It truly will be a new Heaven and a new Earth...all starting with a simple approach and the grasp of a hand.

May these snowy days of winter be filled with the warmth of Christ's healing presence in our midst.

At-Home Lenten Retreat

**Jesus, Wounded Healer Perfected Through Suffering:
Exploring the transforming role of suffering in
Jesus' life and your own**

Scripture will guide our retreat. "Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered; and when he was made perfect, he became the source of eternal life for all who obey him." Heb. 5: 8-9

Jesus the Christ, our wounded healer, calls to us in this time of suffering. We are wounded and desire healing. Following Jesus through our Lenten retreat we will stay awake with Jesus as he is wounded and suffers for us. We will give thanks for his great love and salvific suffering as we explore our own suffering and its transforming power. Responding to his love, we may allow Jesus to enter through our own wounds, heal us with his saving love, and be transformed. We, too, may become wounded healers to our world as His healing love flows through us to others.



Retreat packet materials will support learning through Scripture and offer teachings of Richard Rhor, Cynthia Bourgeault, Marcus Borg, Joan Chittister, Paul Coutinho SJ, Carlo Charrette, St. Ignatius of Loyola, Julien of Norwich, Henri Nouwen, Pope John Paul II, and others as well as poems, prayers, and questions for reflection. Ponder and share with God what touches you. Stay awake and open to God's response. Bring your experiences of God to spiritual direction.

Connecting with the Christ's many forms of suffering through prayer, reading, reflection, group sharing, and individual spiritual direction you will be aided to name and explore your own experiences of suffering and desire for healing. You will have opportunities for three individual one-hour sessions of spiritual direction by phone or zoom scheduled at your convenience.

This retreat is designed to be affordable, convenient, and safe. It will begin with a group Zoom meeting to discuss the retreat's theme and prepare you for our Lenten journey. The fourth week Zoom meeting will include teaching and time to share reflections and responses to material read and support each other as the retreat continues. Community Service of Newburyport is a “privately funded 501(c)(3) social service organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life for individuals, children, and families in need from Newburyport, Newbury, and West Newbury, by providing economic assistance in a caring environment”. Located at St. Paul’s Church in Newburyport, they were forced to close during the pandemic and refer their clients to other organizations in the area for assistance.


Mass Scripture Readings




