From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Temptation

Something comes into view. You want that something. You know you are not supposed to have that something. You want it anyway. Rationalizations come to



mind. "Others have that something, why can't I?" "Having that something is no big deal, everybody gets that something sometimes." "What would happen if I went and got that something?" "Probably nothing, right?" "I mean, who would know?" "It's not like it would be broadcast around or something, right?" "Besides, nobody cares." "Everybody gets something that they aren't supposed to have sometimes, right?"

And so it goes....

Right from the very beginning of Creation, in Paradise no less, Temptation reared its ugly head. We humans learned up front that the quickest way to get rid of Temptation was to give in to it. "Eat the apple!" "It looks yummy!" "Yeah, yeah, yeah, God said not to, but why would God make something so beautiful and tasty-looking, if it wasn't meant to be eaten, right?" "I mean, what's the worst that could happen, right?" "God wags His finger and says, 'Don't do that again,' Right?"

Wrong!

Of course...we have spent the rest of human history paying for that mistake, as if we could ever afford the true cost of our sinfulness and disobedience. When we sin and turn away from the Lord, we commit an offense against the infinite. Which means we who are finite and creature cannot possibly "make it up to God," who is eternal and Creator. We can do all sort of penances, make endless sacrifices, be really, really sorry...tears, sackcloth, fasting... the whole works...but absolutely nothing we could ever do will make things right before God who is perfect.

This is why God had to send His Son, Jesus, to die for us, so that we could live. Only God could right this wrong. The genius of it all, that we have been privileged to barely

understand, is that it took God to enflesh Himself in our humanity, embracing even our sinfulness, that He might redeem it all through the Cross. That's a bit more than God wagging His finger and saying, "Don't do this again." It is a terrifyingly high cost to pay for even the slightest act of disobedience. It ought to make every single one of us shudder with the deepest of emotions at the mere thought of doing something wrong, never mind actually committing an actual sin.

But you and I know that we don't live our lives that way. Of course, we occasionally think about how we could be better. We name a few things that we've done wrong, admit to a couple of failures, acknowledge a few missed opportunities. We sincerely want to do better, most of time. We do love God and we do want to do better, right? But....

Temptation seems to get us again and again. Doesn't it? It comes at the absolute worst of times, when we are weak, tired, or thoroughly distracted. It is subtle beyond words. It is gentle when it needs to be or overt when subtleties are ineffective. It is that last, lonely slice of chocolate cake that beckons to us just as our stomach is rumbling. Give in, and the cake, Temptation, goes away, leaving only the crumbs of our failure behind. "What's a few crumbs, after all?, we might ask." (Please see above!)

So, as we begin this holy Season of Lent, what is the best way to deal with Temptation and our proclivity to sin? This weekend's Gospel passage offers us a few clues. Simply put, they are: The Sacred Scriptures, living our lives prudently and attending to our obligation before the Lord to worship. God's Word—"every Word that flows from the mouth of God"—is instructive to us on our path of holiness. Spending time reading and praying through the Scriptures is a fruitful and effective way to help keep Temptation at bay. Simply put, if you are reading the Bible and praying, you will not have the time or opportunity to engage in sin. And even if you are tempted, God's Word is there to strengthen you and guide you along the right path. As Amy Grant once referenced Psalm 119 years ago in song, "Thy Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path."

The virtue of prudence is also effective in fending off Temptation. It encompasses the whole notion of "avoiding the near occasion of sin," that is part of our traditional Act of Contrition. Sometimes we just know that if we go to a particular place-physically, figuratively, or otherwise-we are going to experience a Temptation to sin. Lent says: "Why go there?!" "Go somewhere else, instead." Build a spiritual wall around the places where Temptation has gotten the better of us, so that we don't inadvertently, in a moment of weakness, at a moment when we might be careless or distracted...make a mistake. If that chocolate cake seems to be serenading you from down the street, avoid even going into the bake shop! Go into the hardware store instead. Nuts and bolts, spackle, and paint brushes will be far less likely to lead you down a pathway to sin than the place where the pastries run free! Seriously, think about it! Where, when, and how does Temptation tend to get the better of you? Lent invites us to ask, "What are ways to avoid being in these circumstances?" "What could we do differently?"

The last example from this weekend's Gospel on how to effectively combat Temptation is to make sure we are attending, properly, to our obligation to worship God. So here, there are a few thoughts: First, am I attending Mass regularly? Simple question. "Yes?" "No?" "Maybe?" "Yes" is better! Secondly, when I worship God, am I doing it fully, actively, and consciously? Am I giving it all that I have? Am I singing the songs, praying the prayers, reflecting during moments of silence, sharing fully in Communion when it is offered.... In short, am I truly participating in the Sacrifice of the Mass, or am I just merely, "present." Present is a good start, full participation is better. And lastly, do I worship God alone, or are there other "gods" in my life, like sex, money, power, addiction, family obligations, "life," etc...that get in the way of my first and primary obligation to the Lord? These can be subtle, too. They can creep up on us, slowly eclipsing our sense of what is important in life and what the true nature of our existence is before God. In short, "does anything regularly keep me from Mass and worship?" Put another way, "Will anything or anyone else get you into Heaven?" If not, then best attend to the command to serve God alone. Beginning this coming Holy Thursday, Cardinal Sean O'Malley has instituted what he is calling, "The Year of the Eucharist," as an opportunity for all of us to deepen our commitment to worship and our devotion to the Lord's Real and True Presence in Holy Communion. Let us open our hearts to receive the fullness of this gift from the Lord.

Taken together, our attentiveness to Scripture, the virtue of prudence, and regular worship of God at Mass will go a long way to forestalling any hold that Temptation might want to have over us. God's grace works wonders in all of these moments and will help us to avoid those instances when we might be enticed to stray and fall short of the glory that God calls us to in our everyday lives.

May this time of Lent be a true opportunity to deepen our friendship with God through our works of penance and acts of charity.

Lenten Guidelines

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.


Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.



In addition, in conjunction with Health Equity International (formerly the Saint Boniface Haiti Foundation), health and dental care services have been made available to the school community.

This Lent, as intentional disciples of Christ, let us pray for our brothers and sisters in Haiti; let us choose a specific time during the week to fast on their behalf; and let us continue to support IC Haiti's efforts through generous almsgiving.

Immaculate Conception School



The IC cracks the code! Immaculate Conception School integrates the use of technology in classrooms to help prepare students for the future. Coding is used in a vast array of industries and services, and is a "language" that today's students need to understand.

Recently, the 1st and 2nd graders at the IC began an online coding program, titled Kodable. Kodable utilizes mazes and furry, alien-like characters to engage students in the beginning concepts of the process of coding and computer science. As the program progresses, students will be challenged to learn concepts such as debugging and condition statements, such as "if then" statements. In addition, students will later be able to create new characters and begin learning game design. Coding programs challenge students to use sequencing, logic, and critical thinking skills to problem solve and create solutions. These skills are valuable both in school and in real world scenarios. Students at the IC will continue to use the coding programs throughout the school year and progress through more challenging levels and skill requirements. Preparing students with 21st century skills is an essential part of the education at Immaculate Conception School.


