From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

One sweltering summer day this past year, I stood alone in a corner of a local cemetery waiting for the bereaved family to gather for the Committal prayers of a loved one. In my black suit, black clerical shirt, black socks, black shoes. . . I could



feel every pore in my body opening up like a geyser. Within minutes, I was soaked. With every fiber of my being, I was trying to find the one spot with the least amount of sunlight creeping through the sparse foliage in a desperate hope of avoiding the full blast of infrared heat from our local nuclear furnace, 93 million miles away. It was fruitless. Add social distancing into the mix followed by the now-present grieving family trying to do the exact same thing I was, I gave up and made a mental note to head to the dry cleaners later that day after scraping the suit from my body.

On a hot summer day, if you are heading to the beach or otherwise able to enjoy the coolness of lighter attire, some warmth can be quite welcome. I mean, we've had a "real" winter this year with lots of snow, ice and bone-chilling temperatures. Who wouldn't want some sunshine and the extra vitamin D? And yet, the Scriptures point out to us so clearly, that we humans have often craved the darkness, and not because were all decked-out in black.

The powerful imagery of light and darkness helps form the stark contrasts in John's Gospel between sin and grace.... between the things of God and our mere human drudgery when we are left to ourselves. There is an old story of when a country village was first offered electricity more than a century ago. One family went through all of the expense and effort to wire up their house and called over neighbors and friends to witness this new marvel. When they threw on the switch for the first time, everyone gasped with delight at how bright the new electric light bulbs made the room. Then, they collectively cringed at how dirty and dingy the walls and paint looked, having been subjected to the soot of oil lamps and wood fires for decades. After suffering the embarrassment of their neighbors and friends seeing how dirty their home really was, the family rolled up their sleeves and got to work scrubbing the walls, the floor and even the furniture until everything gleamed. One of their neighbors, however, who had been witness to the whole thing promptly cancelled their electricity installation appointment, vowing never to allow that kind of light into their home!

Maybe we have felt the same at different points in our life? We see the searing glare of an extensive audit of some situation or another and realize that while we may have not had the exact same failings in our life, we would rather not undergo that level of scrutiny. Instinctively, we know there are imperfections, dust and dirt that would certainly be revealed if an unexpected blast of light were to come our way. So we hide, or avoid, or deflect an honest look into the darkest corners of our lives, afraid of what we might find, afraid of what level of effort it might take to clean them up. A friend of mine who has been involved extensively in recovery programs and helping those with addictions once said to me, "a person is only as sick as their secrets."

Lent is a time when the Church invites us to come forward into the light of Christ's forgiveness, to cease hiding in the darkness of our habits and routines. Rather, we are challenged to confess our failings, put names onto those fears and confidently welcome the intensity of daylight into our crevices. In doing so, if there are things that need addressing or sprucing up, we can do that confidently in the assurance of God's love for us. We know this because, as the author of the Letter to the Ephesians said, that while we were yet still dead in our transgressions, God brought us to new life through Christ. And furthermore, God has a purpose for each of us as His handiwork, that we should be about the good works that God calls us to. . .that there, we have life!

It is possible to live the vast majority of our life darting from one canopy of shade to another, of avoiding the intensity of honest discernment or close personal scrutiny. But the Lenten promise and the Easter joy that follows is that we are saved by God's grace, not by our human efforts. Therefore, we have nothing to fear from confronting our sins, acknowledging our shortcomings and seeking God's forgiveness. As Jesus once said, "I have come that they may have life and have it to the full." (Jn 10:10). There is only life by embracing the light. As John's Gospel also reminds us from the start, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (Jn 1:5)

As we fidget with our clocks this weekend to welcome more sunlight into our day, may we also open our hearts to the true light that God shines upon us through Christ our Savior.

Centering Prayer for Lent

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from the fully human Jesus how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence.

Through prayer, Jesus, strengthened and moved by his Father's love for him, could willingly surrender his human life for love and reveal our God to us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus of Nazareth was transformed to become Jesus the Christ. We, too, can be transformed through prayer that unites us to God. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God.

Women's History Month

During March, we will highlight some Catholic women who have become doctors of the church. A Doctor of the Church is a title given to a saint whose works—including their writings and teachings—have contributed to the theology and philosophy of the Church, who is a tremendously holy person, and who has a great insight of Church doctrine. There are only 36 Doctors of the Church.

St. Catherine of Siena

Although not a religious sister, St. Catherine was a Third Order Dominican and was taught by the sisters to read. Although pressured by her family, she refused to marry,



continued to live at home, devoted her life to Jesus, and served the poor and the sick. St. Catherine was instrumental in convincing Pope Gregory XI to return to Rome from Avignon in 1376. She was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970. Her feast day is April 29.


Immaculate Conception School




