### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

A number of years ago, I was asked in a clergy meeting on evangelization to describe what it was like to meet Jesus for the first time. "What was your first encounter with the Lord like?," was the question at-hand. I recall sitting there for



more than a few moments, trying to think back to the first time that I encountered Jesus in my life. After much consternation, I had to admit that I couldn't do it, because I realized that I always knew the Lord, that Jesus was always present in my life, in the same way that my parents and family were. Just as they were always part of my life growing up, so was my experience with God.

We went to church as a family. We prayed in our home, even if it were just a simple moment of grace before dinner. I had a children's Bible that I read often. . . . OK. I liked the many pictures that went with the stories. I was coached to say my prayers every night before going to bed. "Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the Lord my soul to keep . . . Church holidays and seasons like Christmas and Easter, Advent and Lent were something that we celebrated in our home as much as at Mass. We had Advent calendars marking the days leading up to Christmas pinned to our closet doors. An Advent Wreath adorned our dinner table, its gently increasing candlelight mimicking our anticipation of the birth of the Savior. We carefully gave up sweets (usually chocolate!) during Lent and ate tuna fish and macaroni and cheese on Fridays before Easter, trying to enter into the sacrifice that Jesus made. Easter baskets filled with candy and eggs celebrated the resurrection as much as the Alleluias at church. First Communion and later, Confirmation, were celebrated with festivity. Catholic School awaited me when I entered high school, so that faith and religion would be as much a part of my coursework as English, biology and chemistry. Honestly, I just can't think of a time before I knew the Lord. I grew up knowing Jesus as part of my family life. The images of Him as the Good Shepherd, seeking out those who got lost, healing those who hurt, blessing those who were sad and welcoming us children were ubiquitous. The love that Jesus offered to us

all was echoed in a myriad of smaller ways throughout my growing up. It was all just so. . . "normal."

I guess the words of Jeremiah the prophet had come true in my life, "No longer will they have need to teach their friends and relatives how to know the LORD. All, from least to greatest, shall know me, says the LORD." (Jer 31:34) This isn't to say, of course, that I didn't have my ups and downs in this relationship, or that I always felt close to Jesus. It certainly didn't mean that I ever fully understood what God was doing through my relationship with Christ. But I cannot say it wasn't there in some fashion or other. I wrestled with this relationship as I grew through High School. I agonized over it on a whole new level as I entered the College-level Seminary and began my studies for the priesthood. As an adult, a day doesn't go by when I am not challenged to live this relationship better. But through it all, I have just felt drawn forward in my life by this One who was truly human and truly divine. On my prayer card that was printed as a memento for my ordination, I chose one of the lines from John's Gospel that we heard this weekend: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be." (Jn 12:26) I guess that may be the defining characteristic of my relationship with Jesus Christ-that wherever I have found myself being called to go, He was already there, waiting for me, indeed-ready to walk the journey ahead with me.

I hope that this Lenten season has been fruitful for you. I hope and pray that in some way, these days of penance and reflection have been an opportunity for you to get to know the Lord in a deeper and more personal way. I sincerely hope that you are able to experience Jesus Christ alive and present in your life, travelling with you through life's adventures. Wherever you may go, may you see and experience the Risen Lord in your midst! His invitation to follow Him and His promise to draw all people to Himself remain the same for us today as for those who preceded us in faith, millennia before.

So, what was it like the first time you met the Lord Jesus. . .or have you always known Him as an integral part of your family?

# Palm Sunday Ecumenical Taizé

On Palm Sunday, March 28 at 7:30 p.m., you are cordially invited to attend an Ecumenical Taizé candlelight meditation service at Groveland Congregational Church, 4 King St., Groveland. The service will also be live-streamed on the church's Facebook page, and available afterward for viewing. The program will also be available for printing on the Facebook page.

As we enter into Holy Week, we reflect on Jesus' great love as he takes up the cross for us. The service is modeled after those held at the Taizé community in France, with prayer, song, scripture, petitions and silence.

Taizé prayer is a simple form of ecumenical Christian prayer centered on scripture, silence and song. It involves singing and listening to the word of God in an atmosphere of silence and peace.

Why not enter into Holy Week with these few moments of prayer and reflection!

### **Centering Prayer for Lent**

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from the fully human Jesus how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence.

Through prayer, Jesus, strengthened and moved by his Father's love for him, could willingly surrender his human life for love and reveal our God to us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus of Nazareth was transformed to become Jesus the Christ. We, too, can be transformed through prayer that unites us to God. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God.

Please consider joining us for weekly group Centering Prayer and let God move you closer to him. We gather Wednesday evenings from 6:00–7:00 p.m. via ZOOM for 30 minutes of Centering Prayer and 30 minutes of Lectio Divina. All are welcome. 
