

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I can remember a weeknight many years ago when my father let me stay up well past my bedtime to watch the movie *Midway* on TV because it was obvious that there wasn't going to be school the next day due to the raging snowstorm



outside. What would eventually be known as the infamous "Blizzard of '78" dumped nearly 3 feet of snow on my suburban childhood home and shut down schools and businesses for more than a week afterwards. It was a surreal experience as a kid—opening the garage door the next morning to get ready for shoveling only to be confronted with a solid wall of snow that had drifted up against our house! There were only the vaguest outlines of mounded snow where the family cars had once been parked, their lone antennas sticking up defiantly from the icy depths....

Many of us who lived through the hardship of that experience have many memories of "camping out at home," navigating through snow tunnels, and taking a pause from our regular routines to be humbled by nature. Many, too, found this to be a time of great personal struggle and suffering as some communities were met with flooding and sadly, some lost their lives to raging winter weather.

I had flashbacks to 1978, and September of 2001 as well this past week, as ever-increasing alarm was raised about what measures needed to be taken to respond to the coronavirus threat that was now being proclaimed to be a global pandemic. This drama, played out on TV news conferences and in a seemingly endless stream of email alerts, has effectively shut down our community almost like a blizzard or sudden terrorist attack. I was stunned to learn

that the Archdiocese had suspended all parish Masses indefinitely, after having indicated just hours before that we would be continuing with services. As the reality began to sink in, it dawned on me how much has been lost.

Rather than simply looking at this in terms of personal freedom, of some outside authority telling me I can't go here or do this or that, the restrictions being placed on us all can cause us to grieve for what we can no longer experience—that something of our innocence has been taken from us, something we may never have back. Reflecting many years later on the September 11th terrorist attacks on our country from 2001, I have often craved the seeming simplicity of what life had to offer on September 10th and before. I would love to go back in time and live in that innocent reality once again, if it were possible.

Yet, here we are, facing a new challenge, a new reality in our nation and world, a new, as-yet-undefined "normal," that is unfolding on a daily basis. Just like in times-past, it is unwelcome, scary, and deeply unsettling. Whenever we are forced to go through these moments of change, it can cause us to question everything about our lives. That we have questions, even the deepest of them, is normal and healthy. We are meant to have questions. We are good at asking questions: Why would God allow such a horrid virus to wreck havoc on our world? Why doesn't God just wipe this whole thing out and make it go away? Will God protect those I love and the community I cherish? What will life be like in the weeks, months, and years ahead?

Most of these questions will not be answered quickly or simply. However, if we look to what actually happened in the midst of the many struggles and challenges we have faced over the years, there are some amazing bright spots that have surfaced to remind us that goodness has not gone away, that God's mercies have not been spent. Following a blizzard, do we not take a moment and greet our neighbors? Do we not reach out and help those who may be struggling to clear snow? Do we not check in with neighbors and relatives to see if they are OK and need anything? Do we not look for ways to connect with one another in a time of grief?

After weathering the terrifying news reports during the day of September 11th and being confronted with the terrible grief of losing parishioners and friends, we simply opened the church building that evening and put the lights on for any who wanted to come and pray. That night we had an impromptu Mass for about 600 people who showed up, looking to make some sense of the unthinkable. There is great strength that comes from our shared faith in moments of uncertainty.

This time, however, we are unable to do what we instinctually would seek—to come together to pray, celebrate the Eucharist and draw strength, comfort, and support from our gathered presence.

To be clear—it is vitally important right now that we stay apart as much as possible to slow down the Coronavirus from spreading in our community too quickly—so that our hospitals and healthcare systems do not become overwhelmed and collapse. The government-mandated and

self-imposed quarantine that we are all engaging in some way is the most effective means we have as a society to combat the nightmarish speed of this virus spreading and subduing our ability to resist it.

So, in what ways can we draw strength from our faith during this time of crisis?

This past weekend, utilizing the ubiquitous technology that is ever by our side, I was able to "livestream" a Mass on our Collaborative's Facebook page several times. Though unplanned, it was one way to reclaim an ounce of normalcy in the midst of confusion. The feedback that I received from the dozens who were able to join us through their computers and devices was heartening. In his weekly address during the Angelus, Pope Francis offered the following encouragement for priests and people who were seeking new and creative ways to connect during this tumultuous time:

"In this situation of epidemic, in which we find ourselves more or less isolated, we are invited to rediscover and deepen in the value of the communion which unites all members of the Church....United to Christ we are never alone, but we form one body, of which he is the head," he said, explaining that this unity is fed both by prayer and so-called spiritual communion of the Eucharist, which is an act of prayer made when Catholics are not able to take Communion physically.

Cardinal Sean O'Malley wrote to the priests of the Archdiocese this week: "When we announced that we would begin our Eucharistic year (*The Year of the Eucharist*) on Holy Thursday, I never imagined that that important event would be prefaced by the canceling of the public celebration of the Eucharist. I hope that this period of "fasting from the Eucharist" will increase in our hearts the hunger for the Bread of life, the Body and Blood of Christ."

Going forward, we will be exploring new ways that technology might enable us to stay in better communication with one another as well as experience what virtual connects we can promote that our inner desire for being together in a time of crisis might lead us to that strength and confidence from the Lord's presence that we crave.

Until we can safely gather again in our churches, please plan to join us for Mass online and look to our Collaborative website for other virtual events and resources. This past year, we subscribed to FORMED—a video service that offered a very substantial faith content that I would encourage everyone to take advantage of. Daily Mass is available live-streamed and recorded through Boston Catholic Television and The Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN). Links to these and other resources are available on our website. We will continue to publish our bulletin weekly online, so please download your copy each week when it becomes available on Thursday for the coming weekend.

For now, our Collaborative office will remain open, but we ask you to "visit" by a phone call or email as much as possible.

AA and recovery meetings will continue in our facilities, subject to government restriction on numbers, and our

outreach through the Tuesday evening meal at IC will continue, though the Tuesday meals will be take-out only.

Please do not hesitate to reach out to myself or our Staff members if there is anything that we can do for you or if you are aware of any need within our communities. Despite the limitations imposed on us, we will do everything in our power to help and assist where we can.

It is important to stay focused on the Lord in the midst of the turbulence we are experiencing. If we recall the Gospel story of Jesus walking on the water in the midst of the storm, Peter tried to follow him and walk on the water himself and was actually successful until he took his eyes off of Jesus and looked at the waves and wind that were swirling around him. Then, he started to sink, only to be rescued by the Lord and chastised for his lack of faith. In the middle of our own storm, we, too, must keep our hearts locked on the Lord and trust in His mercy. As our faith has constantly informed us: only in Jesus Christ do we find salvation.

May the Lord bless and protect us in the days ahead and through God's steadfast mercy may we be delivered from the ravages of all illness and disease.



Immaculate Conception School has implemented distance learning for all students due to the school closure from COVID-19. Google G Suite for Education, which the IC has been using for 3 years, is an ideal tool to enable IC students to

continue learning from home. The IC's middle school students have used Google tools on a daily basis throughout the school year for all subjects. The school's younger students are familiar with various tools for creating personalized digital portfolios. Pre-K and Kindergarten students have an appropriately modified learning model that takes into account their ability and skill level. The teachers have the ability to create interactive lessons in real time, as well as video recorded lessons or interactive slide decks that are accessed by the students. Although they are at home, our youngest students can still sing along with the teacher through apps such as SeeSaw. The IC Technology Coordinator has been working with the administration and faculty for the past 3 weeks to implement a plan that would be manageable for families while familiar to students. The faculty has approached the recent school closure as an opportunity to grow, learn and adopt new teaching tools and strategies. Although this is an unpredictable time, the IC is a stronger school community because of COVID-19.





