The Shared Heritage of Our Faiths

This weekend ushers in the Jewish Passover festival, or *Pesach*, and Christianity's observance of Holy Week. Judaism and Christianity share a rich heritage and roots. Both are on full display as the rituals and traditions of each faith unfold during this high holy season.

Jesus' Last Supper was no ordinary meal. It was a Jewish Seder, a memorial to the Passover and Exodus of the Hebrew people in the Old Testament, celebrated on the first two nights of Passover. (See The Passover Seder, right column.)

The original Passover centered on an unblemished lamb whose blood was shed and posted on doors to save the Hebrews' firstborn during the pass over of the Angel of Death. At Jesus' Last Supper, Christ introduced new symbolism into the traditional Passover and instituted what would later become Christianity's Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beginning that evening and continuing the next day in his Passion and Crucifixion, Christ offered himself as the unblemished Lamb of God, sacrificing himself for the salvation of the entire world.

Christ's Last Supper linked forever the Old and New Testaments and Covenants. Both events celebrate the Lord's covenant with mankind: atonement is provided by the promised Messiah for His people.

God commanded the Israelites to remember the Passover and the Exodus from one generation to the next. At the Last Supper, Christ also instructed His Apostles to remember *Him* forever. "Do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19).

The Seder at Passover and the Eucharist are both events of remembrance. However, each commemorates something slightly different. The Passover Seder is a tribute to the history and liberation of the Israelites from captivity in Egypt. The Eucharistic celebration is the "New Passover," rooted in the Seder, and referring in a broader manner to liberating mankind from the slavery of sin and inviting each of us to share in His eternal life.

The weeklong Passover Festival is an annual celebration, as are the events of Holy Week. Each time we celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we connect with a history that extends to our Jewish ancestors in faith as children of the God of Abraham. "In you all the families of earth will be blessed." (Genesis 12:3)

May God bless us all as we observe the holiest days of both faiths.

The Passover Seder

On the evening of March 27, our Jewish brothers and sisters begin the celebration of Passover or *Pesach*, an important high holiday. The first two nights include the Seder (Order), a meal rich in the symbols representing different aspects of the exodus of the Jewish people from Egypt. Passover ends on April 2, following this weeklong celebration of freedom.

The telling of the story has been observed by the Jewish people for over 3,000 years; dictated by the command in Exodus 13:8 to tell the story of the Exodus to children through a Passover specific book called the *Haggadah* (telling).

The Seder is the worship of God through prayer, study, and learning by taking part in what is an annual lesson in Jewish history and faith.

Seated at a dinner table, the focal point of the event is the Seder plate including foods symbolizing the Israelites progression to freedom:



A **roasted shank bone** from a male lamb without blemish and killed in a

way so no bones were broken symbolizing the Pesach sacrifice (lamb) in the Temple,

A **roasted egg** symbolizing either the spring season or mourning (for the destruction of Jerusalem),

Maror (bitter herbs) to represent the bitter experience of the Hebrew slaves,

Charoset (a mixture of apples, nuts, raisins, spices, wine) symbolizing the mortar the Hebrew slaves used to build for the Egyptians, and

Karpas (parsley, celery, or another green vegetable) symbolizing the green of spring.

The table includes three pieces of *matzoh*, a flat cake of unleavened bread. Held in a special pouch, they represent the unleavened bread eaten during the flight from Egypt, which allowed no time for bread to rise. They were to show unhesitating obedience to what God demanded.

An **extra cup of wine** also is left on the table for the prophet Elijah. The door is open for the prophet who will forecast the coming of a Messiah. The chanting of the song *Dayenu* ("it would have been enough") is acknowledgement of the gifts given by God throughout the Exodus.

Judaism is a beautiful faith rich in tradition of which our Christian faith was prophesied in the Old Testament. To our Jewish neighbors and friends we say:

Chag Pesach Semeach—Happy Passover holiday.

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from the fully human Jesus how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence.

Through prayer, Jesus, strengthened and moved by his Father's love for him, could willingly surrender his human life for love and reveal our God to us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus of Nazareth was transformed to become Jesus the Christ. We, too, can be transformed through prayer that unites us to God. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God.

Helping Our Homeless


Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will repay him for his deed.


