

#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Now that we are cresting midway through our Lenten journey, I have to ask the question: How is it going?! For many of us Lent has always been a time of giving up something, spending some extra time praying, doing the Stations of the Cross, making extra donations to



charity, etc.... The list is long and time-honored! I wonder, however, how many of us take the opportunity during this special time of the year to do a little assessment and reconnecting?

If the purpose of Lent is purify, strengthen, and reaffirm our relationship with God so that at Easter we will be ready to renew our Baptismal promises, then perhaps a good use of this sacred season is to look at our relationships with the people that walk life's journey with us and take a good look at how those are going. One of the primary ways that we experience God's love and presence is through the people who make up our family and friends, neighbors and acquaintances. A great place to get a snapshot of all of these individuals at once is to look at our address books—whether they are printed and bound or electronic and virtual.

Scroll through the list of your contacts. See who is there. Ask yourself, "When was the last time I spoke with that person?" Do I see them often? Do I think of them and pray for them regularly? Is there anything that I can do to help them? What would it mean if I were to call them or reach out in some way? Might God bless that conversation, if it were to happen?

Assessment is all about taking account of who's there and how it's going. It is normal for people to walk part of life's journey with us for a while and then, due to a wide variety of circumstances, to move away or lose contact. Sometimes that is OK. Sometimes it is not. Lent is a time to get a read on where all of that is at. Even those we may not be in communication with deserve our prayers.

It can be a joy, too, to reconnect with an old friend. Do we ever consider that Lent is about celebrating the joy of God's enduring presence in our lives? We don't have to wait until Easter to do that! Reconnecting with someone who has fallen off our regular contact list could be an awesome way for the Lord to stir our hearts and deepen our experience of His love and mercy.

Think about it: What do I need to do for Lent? It's not too late to make some adjustments or try something new. Assessing our relationships and reconnecting with a few lost contacts might just be the thing we need to get ready for the Paschal Festivities later in April.

May God bless us all richly in the days ahead.


Our next batch of San Marcos specialty coffee will be freshly roasted and available for \$10/pound after most Masses in our Collaborative this weekend, **March 30–31**.

#### Lenten Guidelines

All **Fridays** during Lent are days of abstinence. **Good Friday** is a day of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should take these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

## **Centering Prayer for Lent**

Our Lenten reflection on Jesus' words and works reveals Jesus' intimate relationship with his Father. This relationship developed through prayer. Often we see Jesus withdraw from the crowds and even his apostles to pray alone in silence. Jesus tells us "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer you enter your private room.

Through prayer, Jesus, strengthened and moved by his Father's love for him, could willingly surrender his human life for love and reveal our God to us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus of Nazareth was transformed to become Jesus the Christ. We, too, can be transformed through prayer that unites us to God. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. Please consider joining us for weekly group Centering Prayer and let God move you closer to him. We gather Wednesdays from 6–7pm in IC Conference Room 209 for 30 minutes of Centering Prayer and 30 minutes of Lectio Divina. Contact Elizabeth McCarthy (978-462-7483) to learn more.
