

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

It is my sincere hope that each of you were able to enjoy a blessed Easter celebration this past week!



That word, "blessed" or blessing has taken on some new meaning this year, hasn't it? In times past, we might have

used a variety of descriptions for these blessings. Family gatherings, a festive church service with a lively choir and bombastic music, flowers galore, a feast well-prepared and laid out for dozens, the joy of a group-outing...the embrace of neighbors and friends. But my suspicion is that our blessings this year were of the more subtle variety, to be found in the simplicity of our present self-isolation and social distancing.

Although our Holy Week liturgies were a pale shade of what they normally are, there was comfort to be found in some familiar music and the power of hearing God's Word. Although it has always been an option, reading the Passion accounts as a straight text rather than breaking them into parts brought the rawness of this Word to bear in a new way for me. The proclaimed Word has an energy and claim on us in a way that simply reading the text privately does

not. It was a joy, too, to welcome a few (very few) parishioners to accompany our Masses as Lectors and Music Ministers. Resiliency was a word that came to mind, as people shared their stories and brought their own joy to each of these moments. It made me hunger for more—a true longing to be able to gather our faith communities for public prayer once again. That longing, I think, is a blessing from God—a holy desire that will bear much fruit in the months ahead.

I have found myself giving thanks for the gift of being able to live with two fine priests, to share this extraordinary time with. The simple blessing of cooking and enjoying a meal together has been a rich reward on many a night. It has sensitized me, too, for the needs of others who might be alone and trying to cope with the isolation of these days. I've found myself making many more phone calls and engaging in texting and social media more than I ever have before. There is a real blessing to be found in staying connected, using whatever means we have. I even participated in my first "Zoom cocktail hour" with a few old friends from Connecticut this past week! A blessing, indeed.

There are more and more people who want to serve and give and help in our community and who are just itching to find a way to be more involved in reaching out to those in need. Although our Collaborative Parish Council took a break from "meeting" (video-conferencing) on the Easter weekend, we will continue to meet regularly in the weeks to come. Our prime topic of conversation is finding new ways to connect those who are able to help with those who have needs. We are well underway to creating an interactive system for enabling that in a greater way within our communities. More information will be available soon about how you can access help or offer assistance. This will be a blessing for all.

Although I have technically had more time for prayer this past month than ever before, I've been finding that my prayer has been different, uncomfortable and awkward at times. Maybe you have had that experience as well. When we go through something new, if unwelcome, we ought not expect that our conversations with those we love will be the same as they were before, when there was no crisis. If we are honest with the people we love and care for, these conversations can reveal our inner anxiety and even fear about what is going on. These moments will never be feelgood experiences, nor should they gloss over our real concerns. They can be hard and halting moments of soulbaring. They can even be bitter and at times unsatisfying, with the answers we crave elusive at best. We must not think that our conversations with God will be any different if we engage Him in prayer. Although we can take great comfort and consolation with talking with a loved-one or an old friend, sometimes even those conversations do not have the clarity or resolution to them that we want. And yet, the blessing is in having the conversation, not in getting the answers. This is why we turn our hearts, raw and wounded, to our Creator and ask again and again for His grace and help. The trick here is not to give up. Just as our human family and friends don't have any clear answers about this present crisis, we don't stop talking to them because of it. So, too, it must be with God.

The difference, however, will be found in the object of the prayer, rather than the subject of conversation. It may seem that God hasn't figured this whole thing out, or is powerless to stop it, or maybe uninterested in our suffering. It might seem that God just doesn't care...surely if He did, He would have healed our world of this viral scourge long-ago, right?! But what if God's answer to all of this was so complicated and intricate, what if His intensely-thought-through response to this crisis was so detailed that no earthly computer or human mind could ever process it all... what if God's answer to our need was just so far beyond our human capacity to understand that He made the proper decision to not try and burden us with an explanation we could never grasp...an explanation that would only confound us and lead us to despair?

What if God simply asks us in this present moment to trust in His love?

You know, that's all God has ever really asked of us anyway—that and to be faithful, even if we don't understand. There's a true blessing in trusting and being faithful. Has not that blessing been present in our midst these days as well? Have we not all been brought to a moment or two these past few weeks when we have had to trust in God's love without the comprehension of the why of it all? Haven't we all been called to a faithfulness of prayer and charity, of care and concern, even though we don't know the greater purpose of every act of love we offer? And is there not a rich blessing in not knowing? Can we see that?

This Easter, as always, we are called to confront the empty tomb as the first sign of Resurrection—not trumpet blasts, not cosmic light shows, not million-strong angel choirs belting out more Alleluias than there are stars in the sky... just the musty emptiness of a tomb that once held the sacred body of our Lord who gave His life for us. There is an immeasurable blessing in that absence, if we open our hearts to believe. That same blessing is here and present for us today. God showers the gift of faith on those who ask for it. Perhaps our prayer this Easter season ought to be: "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief?!"

May the true blessings of this Paschal Season be ours in abundance!

Magnificat — Access daily readings along with various articles, hymns for the month, Lectio Divina, and resources for blessings and prayers. Set alerts to remind you of morning, evening, and nighttime prayer. (This app is free to Magnificat printed version subscribers, non-subscribers pay a fee after download.)


HR St. Vincent de Paul


