

Making real-world connections to learning through STEM activities is an essential way to engage students. Providing students with opportunities to bring their thoughts and ideas to life can effectively provide that connection, as well as develop a variety of skills. The IC

second graders recently read a fictitious story about a group of children who raised money for a cause on their local playground. Reading about playgrounds got the children thinking about the ultimate playground design,



which provided valuable collaborative opportunity create mini models of their ideas. Using recyclable materials such as empty cereal boxes, paper towel tubes, and egg cartons, the students built mini models of a wide variety of playground equipment. Working in groups of three, each design team thought about pedestrian flow and juxtaposition of the playground attractions, especially for important features like the

Community Service First Aid Station. The finished products were amazingly detailed and engineered with an impressive degree of knowledge. In the 21st century, expressing one's thoughts and ideas in 3-dimensions is equally as important as expression through writing, singing, drawing, and calculating. The final step for the 2nd grade

students is to create digital audio books that explain their playground designs and engineering process in building their mini models. STEM activities are a focus at the Immaculate Conception School across all content areas and grade levels.
