## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This week I have been engaged in multiple conversations about what "re-opening" our churches might look like. While it is clearly premature to say exactly when this will happen locally or exactly what we will encounter when it



does, what is becoming clear is that this will likely take place at various paces in different states and regions across the country. Just this week, my Dad sent me a video that was distributed in his own diocese down in Florida that spoke of the changes Catholics are going to see there when things re-open there in a few weeks. Holy Communion will be under the form of bread only and distributed only in the hand. All enclosed confessionals will be shuttered and confessions will be heard in wellventilated spaces with proper distancing. Bulletins will be online-only and there will be no hymnals in the churches. Instead, people will be encouraged to download their worship aids online, use their smartphones to sing from during Mass or to utilize video screens to view the lyrics and music in churches that have them. Those who have chronic conditions or compromised health conditions will be encouraged to remain at home and watch livestreamed Masses instead. And hey...you'll love this one: there will be no collections taken up during Mass or the passing of any baskets. (Instead, there will be baskets at the doors of the church on your way in or out for the Offertory...) (Gotta take a collection somehow, right?!) In short, great efforts will be made to keep people appropriately distanced and free from any physical contact with one another.

Although we may well make different choices up here in Massachusetts when it is our turn to consider re-opening (I'm thinking minimally that facemasks will be involved for everyone up here), it was very interesting to see what one part of the country was doing and how they were addressing a problem common to us all: Until the time when a vaccine is found and widely distributed, how does the worshipping community come up with a viable plan for gathering together for prayer, such as that may be allowed? Differing needs will suggest different approaches. But I think this is a healthy and positive conversation to have among ourselves, nonetheless.

Spring is a time to consider new life and new opportunities. Sure, there will be changes. Some of them may even become permanent or long-lasting. But with every change there is a chance to engage life in a new way, to see new

possibilities that were not there before. For example, we have been livestreaming our weekend Masses within the Collaborative since everything shut down in the middle of March. Although we've had some starts and stops along the way and more than a few technical glitches (continued apologies to Fr. George and all of you for the first half of Holy Thursday's Mass being broadcast sideways! Mea culpa, mea culpa!) we have learned a few things as well, including the breathtaking power of the internet and social media platforms to reach far beyond our local communities to connect family and friends all over our country and world. Just recently I've noticed family, friends, and parishioners from Florida, North Carolina, Connecticut, Missouri, and Oregon "joining us" for Mass on different weekends. How cool is that?! It may well be that Facebook or other social media avenues are a preferred way for those who are shut in for any reason to connect with us and continue to celebrate their faith when they are unable to attend a live Mass in-person.

Across the Archdiocese and country, many churches are choosing different ways to remain engaged with their people during a time when I think so many are naturally looking to our faith and the Church for comfort and guidance. Some parishes have chosen to record their Masses ahead of time which allows for editing and many technical improvements, better video quality, etc.... Having watched some, they do come across very slick and professional and have been nicely done. On the other hand, I've seen the value to livestreaming Masses here, as it gives us a real chance to actually pray together at the same time. In other words, you know that if you "tune in" at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday or 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, you will be united in real-time with the prayer of hundreds of others. In a moment when many can feel so alone and isolated, that can be a tremendous comfort. And, you can still watch the recording later, if you cannot join us live. The best of both worlds, perhaps? A permanent feature that most parishes will offer going forward, post-pandemic? Maybe so. Although there has always been Catholic TV available in most communities for those who were not able to make it to a live Mass, there is a great joy to see and hear the local community celebrating together, to see some familiar faces and realize that the Church is local and alive. While it might seem to be an obvious ministry to be offering regardless of a public health crisis, it has taken a pandemic to spur most of our communities into action.

What other new opportunities might there be? A quick example that has come from our recent Collaborative Parish Council meetings has been the "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" initiative, which simply is an effort to connect those who might have a need with those who might be able to lend a hand. Simple, simple, simple. And yet, were we doing this before? Not on an organized level, not as completely as we could be. So, watch for more to come from this.

Humanly, we cannot run with every new idea that percolates around. But considering the possibilities of what might be can spur new ideas and directions that I believe are the fruit of the Holy Spirit working in our midst. All this, while we self-isolate and hunker down for a little while

longer. Just imagine what we will be able to do with God's help once we are freed?

This weekend let us keep all of our mothers in our prayers—those who have gone home to the Lord and those who are still with us and a part of our lives. May the Lord bless them richly for all of the love, service, sacrifices, and devotion they have offered to us.

Wishing all of you many Springtime blessings and looking forward to the time when we can all gather together again at the Lord's Table.

## **HRIC Supporting Boston Hope**

Boston Hope is the recently developed field hospital in the Boston Convention Center. This thousand-bed hospital is designed to serve as a step-down unit for post-acute COVID-19 patients and homeless patients affected by COVID-19 who do not require hospitalization for acute care. The program and the creation of the facility, led by Partners Healthcare, were created by a partnership between Boston Health Care for the Homeless, Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker and Mayor Marty Walsh.



Jennifer Allard, a resident of Newburyport whose husband, Michael, works at the facility, recently reached out on Facebook asking residents to make posters with inspiring messages for placement at the field

hospital. Staff and patients look forward to any evidence of support from people who are thinking of them, supporting them, and praying for them.

The HRIC Parish Council responded to this request and member Mary Schmidt created a poster to express the gratitude of the HRIC community and to comfort and bless those who are on the front lines of this evolving pandemic.



The IC Coding Program for young students continues to flourish during online learning. Students in grade K–4 have written almost 16,000 programs of coding using Kodable, a digital tool designed to introduce young children

to coding language. There are a host of skills that coding develops, from improved math and writing skills, problem solving, creativity, critical thinking, and computational thinking that identifies patterns, rules, and trends when solving problems. Leveled lessons allow students to build their knowledge, develop resiliency and confidence, and encourage experimentation while solving problems. Our foundation partner, Health Equity International, has asked IC Haiti for a special donation to support the building of a new COVID-19 triage center in Fond-des-Blanc along with the added cost for the operations to address the pandemic. The spread of the COVID-19 virus around Haiti and its effect on our secluded community in the southern peninsula could be catastrophic.


Although the schools are closed and the crossover of residents between villages should be minimized, the Ministry of Health has advised everyone in the country with symptoms of COVID-19 to go to the St. Boniface Hospital in Fond-des-Blanc. This will bring a high concentration of the disease to the neighboring town of our school. Therefore, the spread of the virus to our community has a high potential and the impacts would be devastating.

In response to Health Equity International's request for a special donation as described above, the Board of Directors for IC Haiti voted to approve a \$20,000 donation in the name of the generous people of Immaculate Conception Parish.

The Board is also happy to report that despite parishioners not being able to congregate for Sunday liturgies, people sent in donations to IC Haiti totaling \$4,467 in the first quarter of 2020. We are grateful for this surprising level of generosity given that no collection was actually taken up due to the pandemic. Our next collection will take place the weekend of May 23–24 if we are back together for Masses.

May Our Lord continue to bless our efforts to support the people of Puit Chacha, Haiti. We thank Him for offering us this ministry of service to our brothers and sisters in Christ.
