

### Increase the Deductibility of Your Charitable Giving

Dear Parishioners,

Below is some information that was shared with me that may be helpful to you. People reaching 70½ years old must begin taking withdrawals from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) under the rule for "required minimum distributions" or RMDs. Of course, the distribution means paying taxes on the withdrawn amount.

The Tax Cut and Jobs Act increased the standard deduction. Many individuals who itemized in the past may find that taking the now-higher standard deduction is a better federal tax strategy.

When you take the standard deduction, there is a strict limitation on what you can also deduct for charitable giving. But there is a way for some seniors to still get an increased deduction for their giving, thereby reducing their taxable income even if they don't itemize.

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) can satisfy all or part of the amount of your required minimum distribution from your IRA.

If you directly transfer funds from the IRA to a qualified charity, those dollars count toward the RMD for the year, but are not counted as income. You can effectively claim a tax deduction for increased charitable giving without itemizing deductions.

Be aware that a QCD is available only to IRA owners 70½ years or older. And the maximum annual exclusion for QCDs is \$100,000. If you file a joint return, your spouse also can have a QCD and exclude up to \$100,000. For more details read IRS 590-B "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)." Always check with your financial advisor or tax preparer before making tax or financial decisions.

### Temporary Closure of Nativity Church: New Furnaces & Air Conditioning

Dear Holy Redeemer Parishioners,

To allow for the installation of the new furnace in Nativity Church in Merrimac, it will be necessary to remove part of the flooring to install some key components. This will require the closure of Nativity Church for a short while, hopefully no more than a week.

Right now, this is scheduled to take place the week of **May 23 through Memorial Day weekend**. All Masses scheduled within that timeframe will be moved to St. Ann Church in West Newbury. These will include Masses for the Ascension Holy Day (Thursday 5/26) as well as all Memorial Day weekend Masses. At this time, we anticipate that Mass will return to Nativity Church on Sunday morning June 5 at 8:30 a.m.

The new furnaces and future air conditioning units in **both** Holy Redeemer churches are the final part of our Capital Campaign begun approximately 6 years ago. While your generous response to this multi-year fundraising effort enabled many repairs and significant improvements to be made in both of our churches, we need an additional \$14,000 to complete the air-conditioning components for the churches. There are bright, yellow envelopes in the entranceways of both churches marked "Furnace Replacement." These can be used to make contributions towards completing the air conditioning components of the HVAC projects in both churches. Once our goal has been met, the air conditioning will be installed in each church. The current funds raised through the Capital Campaign have been sufficient to allow for the new furnaces to be installed at this time in each church. Because of the different structure and access to the basement of St. Ann's Church in West Newbury, the new furnace will be installed there in the weeks ahead without interruption of weekend worship.

I apologize for any inconvenience for parishioners during this installation at Nativity, particularly in light of the ongoing closure of the Rocks Village Bridge. Please watch the bulletin and our website for any updates.
