From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

More than a few times, I have seen people's faces glaze over with numbness when this Gospel passage is proclaimed: "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you." (Jn 14:20) Part of what is



known as Jesus' "high priestly prayer" or his final discourse, this line and those that follow can have our heads spinning—"I in you, you in me, the Father in us..." What?!

Seriously, what in the world is Jesus talking about? It all seems so ethereal on the surface—poetic, yet inaccessible. Nonetheless, the opposite is exactly what Jesus is trying to convey—simply put, that although He is ascending to His Heavenly Father, He will remain close to us through an inner intimacy that is not found elsewhere in the world. This will be sealed or founded by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, who will counsel and guide us in all things, just as if Jesus Himself were right here with us. Sounds too good to be true, doesn't it? Yet a little exploration of Hebrew cosmology throws some light on this prayer.

In ancient times, the Hebrew view of the world consisted of the earth being a flat disc that was supported from underneath by great pillars. Below was hades, or the abode of the dead. Above the earth was the dome of the sky that held the sun and clouds, the moon and the stars. Above that dome were the waters of the heavens that occasionally rained down on the earth below through great floodgates in the dome of the sky. And, above that...was Heaven, where God and the angels live. In this model of the universe, God was completely inaccessible by humans. God could "come down from Heaven" if He wanted to, but there was no way for humans to access anything above the dome of the sky. This was the whole folly of the Tower of Babel-humans thinking they could become like God if they built a tower high enough to raise them into the sky and thus have access to Heaven. We all know how that one ended!

So, with Jesus using all this intimate language in describing how close He is to God the Father, and thus how close we are as well through Him...well, it requires a serious re-thinking of the whole world order—the universe, really.

What is being revealed is that Heaven isn't so much a place "up there" somewhere, out beyond the realm of the stars and planets, but that Heaven is first and foremost about a relationship that is so close and intimate, that no

one need look beyond their own friendship with Jesus Christ to experience the fullness of it. Jesus' farewell words to His closest friends are meant to comfort them and all of us who would follow by reminding everyone of how tightly bonded we have become with God through Jesus' sacrifice that He was about to offer on the Cross. That one, singular act of perfect, selfless love united Heaven and earth in a relationship that transcends death and leads only to new life. And just in case our minds and hearts can't quite get a grasp on the whole thing and keep the big picture in focus, God will send the Holy Spirit to remind us of what Jesus taught and to gently (OK, sometime NOT so gently!) nudge us in making the right decisions as disciples.

So, to be close to God we don't have to climb a mountain or build a tower, we don't have to squeeze our way through some aerial floodgates or dodge the swirling sun and stars...we only have to cling to our deep friendship with Jesus Christ. He modeled for us what it means to live a truly human life-full of love, mercy, compassion, honesty and joy. Our response to the Lord is thus a human onewe are attracted to that pure, selfless love that conquers all things. Our inner bond with the Lord is thus cemented first in our hearts where the fire of His love makes a claim. To have that experience, even a little, is to glimpse the eternal-to see the Father's love for us all. Because God held nothing back in sending His own Son to die for us, Jesus Christ held nothing back in freely offering His life on the Cross...all so that we might live in this inner intimacy to which we have been privileged to be invited.

Comforting news when we are all stuck at home and selfisolating these days., eh?! You don't have to go anywhere to experience the Eternal Now of our triune God. You can do that right from the comfort of your own home, from your own couch if you like. Jesus comes to us in the midst of where we are. We don't have to go find Him somewhere, as if He were missing. The true beauty of this Gospel passage is that God has always been right here in our presence, closer than even any family member or friend. The joy is opening our minds and hearts to see and recognize the most awesome of gifts which has always been profoundly close to us, if often unseen and unacknowledged.

It's OK to glaze over every once in a while, when we human beings start tripping over our own words in trying to describe the indescribable. Just remember that all the theology in the world cannot begin to scratch the surface of who God is or just how much God loves us or how close God wants to be with us.

It's a "wicked lot..." and I'll just leave it at that.

IC Haiti News

These are unprecedented times in our world. People across the globe, including Haiti and the United States, are addressing the spread of the highly contagious and deadly virus, COVID-19. Our foundation partner, Health Equity International, has asked IC Haiti for a special donation to support the building of a new COVID-19 triage center in Fond-des-Blanc along with the added cost for the operations to address the pandemic. The spread of the COVID-19 virus around Haiti and its effect on our secluded community in the southern peninsula could be catastrophic.

Although the schools are closed and the crossover of residents between villages should be minimized, the Ministry of Health has advised everyone in the country with symptoms of COVID-19 to go to the St. Boniface Hospital in Fond-des-Blanc. This will bring a high concentration of the disease to the neighboring town of our school. Therefore, the spread of the virus to our community has a high potential and the impacts would be devastating.

In response to Health Equity International's request for a special donation as described above, the Board of Directors for IC Haiti voted to approve a \$20,000 donation in the name of the generous people of Immaculate Conception Parish.

The Board is also happy to report that despite parishioners not being able to congregate for Sunday liturgies, people sent in donations to IC Haiti totaling \$4,467 in the first quarter of 2020. We are grateful for this surprising level of generosity given that no collection was actually taken up due to the pandemic. Our next collection will take place the weekend of May 23–24 if we are back together for Masses.

May Our Lord continue to bless our efforts to support the people of Puit Chacha, Haiti. We thank Him for offering us this ministry of service to our brothers and sisters in Christ.
